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About the Institute

The Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation, a research division of Carnegie Mellon University, specializes in the history of botany and all aspects of plant science and serves the international scientific community through research and documentation. To this end, the Institute acquires and maintains authoritative collections of books, plant images, manuscripts, portraits and data files, and provides publications and other modes of information service. The Institute meets the reference needs of botanists, biologists, historians, conservationists, librarians, bibliographers and the public at large, especially those concerned with any aspect of the North American flora.

Hunt Institute was dedicated in 1961 as the Rachel McMasters Miller Hunt Botanical Library, an international center for bibliographical research and service in the interests of botany and horticulture, as well as a center for the study of all aspects of the history of the plant sciences. By 1971 the Library's activities had so diversified that the name was changed to Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation. Growth in collections and research projects led to the establishment of four programmatic departments: Archives, Art, Bibliography and the Library.

The hotel will be host at a Cocktail Party Monday evening, October 26th, so plan your arrival early.




Dear Sir:



Our records show that you have not received a copy of the 1960 Proceedings (Volume 73) of the Florida State Horticultural Society. This volume contains some 430 pages and is a fairly complete account of Florida horticulture for the year 1960.

In the General Session the reorganization of the State Department of Agriculture was discussed by Hon. Doyle Conner, followed by an address on Agriculture's Tax Dollars by Past President Howard A. Thullbery.

The Vegetable Section has 25 papers dealing with pesticides, fertilizers, virus diseases, nematodes and mulches.

In the Citrus Section a total of 19 papers are printed on pest control, fertility, weed control, burrowing nematodes and varieties.

The Processing Section has 22 reports dealing with freezing, processing and quality studies of citrus, vegetables, avocados and limes.


In the Krome Section there are papers on fertility and related factors on papayas, mangoes, pecans and grapes.

The Ornamental Section has 24 papers dealing with ornamental shrubs, chrysanthemums, gladiolus, gardenias, orchids and foliage plants.
