By 1971 the Library's activities had so diversified that the name was changed to Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation. Growth in collections and research projects led to the establishment of four programmatic departments: Archives, Art, Bibliography and the Library.

Dear Mrs. Popenoe:


I do not think we have written you since accepting your delightful hospitality. If so, you must think us very rude house guests. But there are reasons.
