The Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation, a research division of Carnegie Mellon University, specializes in the history of botany and all aspects of plant science and serves the international scientific community through research and documentation. To this end, the Institute acquires and maintains authoritative collections of books, plant images, manuscripts, portraits and data files, and provides publications and other modes of information service. The Institute meets the reference needs of botanists, biologists, historians, conservationists, librarians, bibliographers and the public at large, especially those concerned with any aspect of the North American flora.

Hunt Institute was dedicated in 1961 as the Rachel McMasters Miller Hunt Botanical Library, an international center for bibliographical research and service in the interests of botany and horticulture, as well as a center for the study of all aspects of the history of the plant sciences. By 1971 the Library's activities had so diversified that the name was changed to Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation. Growth in collections and research projects led to the establishment of four programmatic departments: Archives, Art, Bibliography and the Library.

The intention of this Work is to give accurate figures and descriptions of such subjects in Zoology as are either altogether new, unfigured, or require elucidation, as well as occasionally introducing *types*, or examples, of such Genera, as the advanced state of the science has rendered it necessary to establish.

Particular care will be taken in the colouring of the plates, to bring them as near the original drawings of the Author as possible; and as the Lithographic art is peculiarly adapted for this purpose, it will be used for such subjects as are best represented by this mode of engraving, while those that require the superior sharpness and delicacy of the graver, will be done on copper. The Entomological portion of these latter, where the generic dissections are introduced, will be drawn and engraved by Mr. Curtis, whose unrivalled abilities in this department are well known; and it is hoped the work altogether will keep pace with the present state of the science; and the increasing taste for it manifested in this country.

The Zoological Illustrations will appear in Monthly Numbers, each containing six coloured plates, with corresponding descriptions, in royal octavo, price 4s. 6d.; and the usual Title-page, Index, &c. will be given when one volume is completed.
