I have your Christmas card with note about the bibliography in it. I am glad that Gomez Pompa is going to take over a bit of the distribution of the work in Mexico and Central America.

There are other places, the Ag School in Panama for example, and a new set up on the north coast of Honduras that I don't know much about. Heller will undoubtedly put his into the library of the school being planned by Harvard for Monte Fresco.

We have pieces and parcels of land scattered all over the place and are going down into the Arkansas Ozarks in a few days to look at land in the vicinity of Eureka Springs. Just how miserable is it in the Winter?

I wrote a note to my friend Al. Heller sometime since and told him that we had been down there looking at land. Got a return mail letter from him saying have you thought about Nicaragua? -- He has one of the fanciest places in Central America, - looks out from the Sierra de Managua across the city below, Lake Managua and a hand full of volcanoes. He has given Harvard University about 50 acres of the land. The University plans to put a business school there and I understand that some of the work is already under way. The rest of the land, a considerable bit I believe, he has turned over to a "corporation" and it is to be broken up into a colonia. I don't know yet what the cost of a bit of land is to be there although I do know that they think that they are going to develop one of the more interesting places in the Central American region. Heller himself is much interested in natural History of the region and has spent quite a lot of his energy working at it himself. I suppose that his interest in trying to get us to say that we will come is partly based on the idea that he would like to have a professional botanist there who would take up work with the flora of the region. We plan to go on with our Central American work after retirement. If this project goes through, and I suspect that it will, we may set up a place down there to do the necessary field work with the region and then continue on with some of the "youngsters" that we have here

working toward the flora of Nicaragua, Honduras and El Salvador, the next major work on our list.

We got Johnnie Gentry, one of Art Cronquist's students, to come here. He is interested in floristics and will work into the central Central American flora well I think. I have him working on the Solanaceae for the flora of Guatemala right now to give him some experience under my direct supervision. As soon as that is done I hope that he will devote the major part of his energy to the other one, - along with Molina, myself as soon as Guatemala is finished and I retire. Actually my official retirement date is not so far away, - only four years, - but I suspect that I will not stop working.
