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About the Institute

The Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation, a research division of Carnegie Mellon University, specializes in the history of botany and all aspects of plant science and serves the international scientific community through research and documentation. To this end, the Institute acquires and maintains authoritative collections of books, plant images, manuscripts, portraits and data files, and provides publications and other modes of information service. The Institute meets the reference needs of botanists, biologists, historians, conservationists, librarians, bibliographers and the public at large, especially those concerned with any aspect of the North American flora.

Hunt Institute was dedicated in 1961 as the Rachel McMasters Miller Hunt Botanical Library, an international center for bibliographical research and service in the interests of botany and horticulture, as well as a center for the study of all aspects of the history of the plant sciences. By 1971 the Library's activities had so diversified that the name was changed to Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation. Growth in collections and research projects led to the establishment of four programmatic departments: Archives, Art, Bibliography and the Library.



**Editor Needed for
Bulletin of Peace Proposals**

All over the world, an increasing number of Proposals for Peace are made; in East and West, North and South, by statesmen and "peaceniks," by individuals and organizations. These proposals vary widely as to their quality, but it is difficult for us today to differentiate between useful proposals and those which deserve rapid oblivion.

For that reason, the Peace Research Institute in Oslo and the International Confederation for Disarmament and Peace are interested in the publication of a *Bulletin of Peace Proposals*. The Bulletin would be published monthly or bi-monthly by the Peace Research Institute, and contain in a standardized form all recent published peace proposals accessible to the editor as long as they have a reasonable degree of relevance and specificity. The *Bulletin* would be politically neutral, contain no comments, and be at the disposal of interested governments, individuals, and organizations.

The very dissemination, in an easy surveyable form, of the many excellent proposals made by statesmen, by governments, Pugwash Conference, individuals and peace groups, or in the form of policy implications of peace research, would in itself be a significant contribution to peace.

For this purpose, the PRIO and the ICDP seek to establish contact with a person capable of independent work who would function as editor of this *Bulletin*. The following qualifications are required:

Perfect knowledge of English and reading knowledge of one or two other major languages.

Interest in, and knowledge of international politics.

Knowledge of the peace movement.

Some training in the social science in order to gain an intelligent understanding of peace research literature.

If an agreement can be reached and sufficient funds found, the successful applicant will work out of Oslo at a salary of £1,000 to £1,200 a year, beginning early 1965. Please address all enquiries to:





Dear Mrs. Langman:

Congratulations on your travels, accomplishment, and extension of grant.

First a word about my labors and then an assessment of the travel literature -

Moving here from Washington U constituted a minimum interruption to my getting out my Martin López: Conquistador Citizen of Mexico in April of this year. Then I moved to mop up the last stages of my William Hickling Prescott: An Annotated Bibliography of Published Works which will be released by the Hispanic Foundation as an LC-sponsored work next month (December, 1958). Meanwhile I wrote, contracted and pushed to printer my Prescott and His Publishers, a 350-page work which is now at page proof stage (I get them next week) and will be released by Southern Illinois University Press in February, 1959. On the side I wrote four essays for four journals in connection with the centenary of Prescott's death in January, 1959 - they will appear in Historia Mexicana, the new Journal of Inter-American Studies, The Americas, and the Hispanic American Historical Review. I have just polished off the text of my paper "Prescott Before the World" which I will deliver at the American Historical Association meeting in Washington on December 30. In addition I am deep in further Prescott study and have another 16th century Mexican study to be published in December, 1959.

Now to the travel literature. The University of North Carolina Press has contracted to publish my edited text of the journal and correspondence of Edward Thornton Tayloe about Mexico during the period 1825-1828. So I am thrusting on the market still another item for your endless bibliography.

With my other commitments I see no prospect for executing a supplement to the original travel bibliography I published in The Americas. I urge and insist that you do it as an individual, assuming you still believe it desirable. Someday I hope and plan to do more with the Mexican travel literature but can do nothing further now. Incidentally, have you kept abreast of state historical journals in the last several years - more than one has printed portions of Mexican war journals. At the moment the Kentucky Register in recent issues comes to mind.

If you need the various lists you kindly sent me, I shall make copies and return them. Meanwhile I am most appreciative and wish you, and Oscar, the best of everything.

It was the result of my first contacts with the *European Herbals* & I did not realize how complicated were the problems of identification involved. My identification of *O. lamarkiana* proved to be incorrect, but I at least learned a good deal about the identification of plants from early picturas & descriptions of them. There are ~~several~~ *Osmothera* in Mexico but I do not think any of them are in the early herbals.




Would it be possible to receive 3 publications with your article on the Mexican Libraries, corresponding to March, 1960?
