MEMORANDUM TO ALL ACADEMIC PERSONNEL:

Re: Annual Supplement to Bio-Bibliography

In order to supplement information gained from other sources on regular teaching and research activities, it is requested that each member of the faculty notify the Bio-Bibliographical Service of changes in citizenship, address, marital status; and indicate any committee service, special appointments, professional activities other than teaching, honors, and publications for the period from July 1, 1951 through June 30, 1952. The Bio-Bibliographical files are consulted by committees of the Academic Senate, the President, his chief local administrative officers and agencies concerned with matters of public information, compilation of "honors" data, maintenance of committee service files, and the keeping of special records in connection with sabbatical leaves and grants-in-aid.

Sabbatical Leave Reports

Sabbatical leaves granted during the past academic year should, in accordance with University Regulation #24, be documented by a report to the President "on the results of . . . sabbatical leave for retention in the bio-bibliographical file." As all publications for the preceding academic year are to be listed in the supplement it is no longer necessary to submit this information separately on library cards. However, it is still important and necessary for reprints and copies of publications to be submitted. These are kept on file in the University Archives. For the convenience of faculty members it is acceptable to retain all reprints and copies of publications and to send them in once a year with the supplement rather than sporadically throughout the year.

Thomas Harper Goodspeed se educó en Suiza, Francia y Alemania; realizó estudios en la Universidad de Chicago, en la Universidad de Brown y en la Universidad de California, donde obtuvo su título de Dr. en Filosofía en 1912. De 1922 a 1923 permaneció en Suecia, realizando estudios especiales en su calidad de becado de la Fundación Escandinavo-Americana, y en los años de 1930 y 1931 estudió en Alemania, Inglaterra y Austria como becado de la Fundación Guggenheim. En 1938 volvió a Inglaterra y Europa para realizar diversos estudios en los museos botánicos de ese Continente.

El Dr. Goodspeed ha realizado numerosas e importantes expediciones botánicas: en 1932-33 organizó para la Universidad de California una expedición al Tíbet y la China Occidental, regresando con una de las colecciones más cuantiosas que se haya reunido en dichos países, especialmente rica en especies del género *Rhododendron*; por ello la colección de este género del Jardín Botánico de Berkeley es una de las más completas del mundo.

En 1935-y 1936 viajó por primera vez a Sud América en calidad de becado por la Fundación Guggenheim y como Director de la Primera Expedición de la Universidad de California a los Andes. En colaboración

con tres coleccionistas y ayudantes especiales hizo importantes colecciones de plantas en el Perú, Chile y Bolivia. En 1938 y 1939 dirigió, durante diez meses, una exploración que, partiendo del Perú, recorrió Bolivia, Chile y la Argentina, llegando hasta la Tierra del Fuego, acompañado de ocho coleccionistas.

En 1946 invitado por el Ministerio de Educación de Colombia y por las Universidades e Instituciones científicas de Colombia, el Dr. Goodspeed, acompañado de su esposa permaneció en esta república tres meses. Dictó conferencias en Bogotá, Medellín y Cali sobre temas de interés general, tales como la Conservación de la Vida Silvestre, la Importancia de un Jardín Botánico en la Vida de una Comunidad, y las Experiencias de los Buscadores de Plantas de los Andes. En conferencias de carácter más técnico, discutió el origen de la planta del tabaco, el papel desarrollado por el núcleo en la herencia y la historia de la ciencia botánica.

El Doctor Goodspeed ha venido a Sud America por quinta vez desde 1935, en primer lugar para aceptar la invitacion hecha por el Segundo Congreso Botanica Sud Americano para ocupar la Presidencia de su Seccion de Citologia y Genetica. Esta importante reunion de botanicos, que ha llamado la atencion del mundo entero y a la cual asistirán muchos estudiantes eminentes de las ciencias botanicas, se celebrara en Tucuman del 10 al 17 de octubre bajo los auspicios de la renombrada Universidad de Tucuman. El Instituto Miguel Lillo, asociado a esa Universidad, es estimado por todo el mundo por sus estudios de las floras de la Argentina. La oportunidad de examinar sus valiosisimas colecciones de la zona templada de Sud America es uno de los atractivos del Congreso para los botanicos extranjeros.

Como Presidente de la Seccion de Citologia y Genetica, el Dr. Goodspeed dara una conferencia ilustrada sobre "Adelantos Recientes en la Citogenetica". Tambien dictara otra conferencia acerca de la "Agricultura Cientifica en California", ilustrada con una cinta cinematografica. Traera consigo diapositivas en colores naturales del Jardin Botanico de California y de la horticultura profesional y de aficionados en California, asi como de los arboles mas famosos del mundo -- las Sequoias de California.

Despues del Congreso, el Dr. Goodspeed pasara varias semanas en la Argentina para obtener material para un libro que esta preparando acerca del futuro de la agricultura en la Argentina. En el viaje de regreso pasara seis semanas en Chile y Peru donde dictara conferencias, y consultara con los Ministerios de Agricultura. En Chile completara la preparacion de una monografia sobre la fitogeografia de esa republica. En Peru continuara el trabajo de la Cuarta Expedicion de la Universidad de California a los Andes.
