About the Institute

The Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation, a research division of Carnegie Mellon University, specializes in the history of botany and all aspects of plant science and serves the international scientific community through research and documentation. To this end, the Institute acquires and maintains authoritative collections of books, plant images, manuscripts, portraits and data files, and provides publications and other modes of information service. The Institute meets the reference needs of botanists, biologists, historians, conservationists, librarians, bibliographers and the public at large, especially those concerned with any aspect of the North American flora.

Hunt Institute was dedicated in 1961 as the Rachel McMasters Miller Hunt Botanical Library, an international center for bibliographical research and service in the interests of botany and horticulture, as well as a center for the study of all aspects of the history of the plant sciences. By 1971 the Library's activities had so diversified that the name was changed to Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation. Growth in collections and research projects led to the establishment of four programmatic departments: Archives, Art, Bibliography and the Library.

Dr. T. H. Goodspeed will leave next week for South America to direct the Sixth University of California Botanical Garden Expedition to the Andes. He has recently completed 48 years of service to the University as Professor of Botany and Director of the Botanical Garden.

Thirty years ago the Botanical Garden was moved from the center of the Berkeley campus to a site at the head of Strawberry Canyon. Developed under Dr. Goodspeed's direction on originally barren slopes of the Berkeley Hills, it has become one of the most attractive areas in the Bay region and attracts thousands of local and out-of-state visitors annually. Over 90,000 plants, including many mature trees and shrubs, have been landscaped to conform to the natural contours of the terrain. The large collection of Rhododendron species and hybrids contains many unique specimens collected by the Botanical Garden's expedition to West China and Tibet in 1930. In addition to supplying living plants for classroom use collections are grown for the research of the Botanical Garden staff and other members of the Faculty. A number of these research collections are among the most scientifically important in this country.

From the Botanical Garden the first plant hunting expedition was sent to South America in 1935 under Dr. Goodspeed's direction to obtain new or little known plants of potential scientific, industrial and agricultural value to be grown and tested in Berkeley. During the four following South American expeditions which he has directed studies were made of the character and distribution of the floras of the Andes and nearby regions from the equator to Magellan Strait.

Seed and living plants of hundreds of species were brought back to the Botanical Garden to form its South American unit. Many thousands of dried plant specimens were obtained to enrich the noteworthy collection of South American species in the University's Herbarium. Duplicate specimens have been sent to other leading herbaria in this country and abroad.

In addition to obtaining a large amount of significant scientific information the five previous South American expeditions have aided American agriculture by finding the wild South American ancestors of such important crop plants as tobacco and tomato. These ancestors are often resistant to diseases which cause millions of dollars of crop losses every year. Plant breeders have been able to transfer this ancestral disease resistance to modern commercial varieties, and greatly to reduce to crop losses.

The governments of South American republics have cooperated in many ways with the work of the expeditions and Dr. Goodspeed has reciprocated by lecturing in the universities of Colombia, Peru, Chile and Argentina as an honorary Professor of Botany. At the request of the Ministries of Agriculture of Peru and Chile he has designed and assisted in the development of their Botanical Gardens of which he has been Honorary Director. He has been awarded the highest rank of the Chilean decoration, Orden al Merito, "Bernardo O'Higgins" and elected an honorary member of South American Academies of Science and of other scientific societies. In 1948 as a guest of the Republic of Argentina he served as Vice-President of the Second South American Botanical Congress held in Tucuman.

In South America Dr. Goodspeed's principal objective has been the collection of the wild relatives of the tobacco plant and mapping of their distribution. Tobacco belongs to the plant genus Nicotiana which had its origin in South America where most of its species are found. A number of previously unknown tobacco relatives were discovered and added to the Nicotiana collection in the Botanical Garden in Berkeley. It is the largest collection in the world of that plant genus and seeds of over 75 species and varieties have been distributed to agricultural institutions in many countries for experiments in tobacco improvement. Dr. Goodspeed is the world's leading authority on the genus Nicotiana and at the 1955 Paris International Scientific Tobacco Congress was awarded a medal for his research on the tobacco plant and its relatives.

On the Sixth Expedition Dr. Goodspeed is being assisted by Mr. Paul C. Hutchison who arrived in Peru in August accompanied by Mr. William Marshall as collector and photographer. They are making a survey of the remarkable cactus flora of Peru and Bolivia and also collections of orchids and other plants of scientific and ornamental importance. Dr. and Mrs. Goodspeed will join them for six weeks in Peru and later spend three months in Chile and Argentina to study the relation between present day plant distribution in western South America and the geological history of the Andes. They will return to Berkeley in April of next year.

About December 7 we go to Santiago and our address there will be
c/o Agricultural Attache, American Embassy, Santiago, Chile.

We will probably go to southern Chile just after Christmas to
remain for approximately a month (January 28±). During that
month our mail will be forwarded by the Embassy in Santiago or
we will give you our hotel address in the south.

From southern Chile we cross into northern Argentine Patagonia
and probably will spend a week or so there. We will know suf-
ficiently in advance to give you our hotel address.

About February 8 we fly to Buenos Aires where our address until
February 28 (±) will be c/o Agricultural Attache, American
Embassy, Buenos Aires, Argentina.

From Buenos Aires we may go for a few days to Tucuman (N.W. Argentina)
but in any case will fly to Santiago, Chile, to arrive in the first
days of March.

After a day or two in Santiago (above address) we go to Valparaiso (above
address) and sail on a Grace Line ship March 7.

Arrive Cristobal on March 19 and expect to connect with a California-bound
Johnson Line steamer. The return voyage Cristobal-San Francisco may be
15 days and we should be home about the end of the first week of April.

Airmail to Lima takes about 3 days, to Santiago 4-5 days, to Buenos Aires 4-5 days.
Letters can, if necessary or desired, be sent, for example, to Cristobal, Panama, passengers Johnson
Line S S Los Angeles, arriving October 10.
We will later be able to give ports of call on our return voyage.

Progress Report

Sixth University of California Botanical Garden
Expedition to the Andes

Peru, August 1 to December 15, 1957

Personnel in Peru -- Paul C. Hutchison, Senior Botanist, University of California Botanical Garden; William H. Marshall, collector and photographer (both during the above period); T.H. Goodspeed, Director of the Expedition, (October 15 to November 20)

Areas of collection -- As shown by the attached map the entire coast of Peru has been traversed. This is botanically a unique area because during the Peruvian winter (June to October) heavy fogs on the coastal mountains produce a distinctive flora, in what during the remainder of the year is a desert of maximum aridity. In addition to an arid coast Peru consists -- topographically, climatically and vegetationally -- of two other zones, the Andean ranges with high plateau flores and the tropical rain forests (Amazonian) east of the Andes. The map shows that both of these interior zones were explored botanically, particular areas being selected for study because of lack of knowledge of their vegetation. Each of the numerous incursions into the interior was made over extremely bad roads which entered or crossed the Andes often at altitudes of approximately 15,000' with very steep ascents and descents. The Ford truck, with auxiliary transmission, was able quite successfully to meet the transportation problems; total mileage was approximately 11,000.

Accomplishments

1) Over 1100 different plant collections, certain of them representing species previously unknown, were made, as living plants to be grown in the University of California Botanical Garden or as pressed specimens to enrich the representation of South American floras in the University Herbarium. Usually a considerable number of duplicate specimens were pressed for purposes of exchange by the Herbarium with scientific institutions throughout the world. The total number of living and dried collections was approximately 11,000. In terms of scientific significance this is one of the outstanding collections of plants that has been made in Peru.

2) Evidence was obtained which will solve problems of classification in certain plant groups especially well represented in the Peruvian floras. Particularly in the Cacti it was possible to verify or disprove by evidence in the field published statements concerning the proper status of all the major subdivisions and of the majority of the individual species.

3) From the collections of living plants there will be introduced for the first time into cultivation in California a considerable number of orchids, ferns and cacti of potential scientific and ornamental importance. In the seed collections there should be additional introductions of similar importance.

4) Certain areas were discovered which, previously unknown botanically, proved to be exceedingly rich in new or little known species. When more thoroughly explored these areas should provide evidence bearing upon problems of plant distribution in the Andes and adjacent regions.

The success of the Peruvian section of the Expedition was due to the untiring efforts of Mr. Hutchison and Mr. Marshall. They were forced to remain for considerable periods in regions subjected to extremes of altitude and temperature where accommodations were lacking or extremely primitive.
