Hunt Institute was dedicated in 1961 as the Rachel McMasters Miller Hunt Botanical Library, an international center for bibliographical research and service in the interests of botany and horticulture, as well as a center for the study of all aspects of the history of the plant sciences. By 1971 the Library's activities had so diversified that the name was changed to Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation. Growth in collections and research projects led to the establishment of four programmatic departments: Archives, Art, Bibliography and the Library.

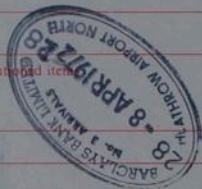



You will be surprised with such a quick reply. However, the occasion of a letter relative to your whereabouts is sufficient reason to put off a few other things.

The only answers I can give to your questions are guesses.

As regards travel, I also understand that the German Government is paying the bill for the Rome meeting. My guess is that those funds probably would cover your trip to Rome. I believe Keith Finlay (CIMMYT) and Jorge Leon and Lothar Seidewitz are the ones mainly concerned with setting up the program for the Rome conference. You should write Keith for more information on that. When the program is made up I am sure they will follow through on travel arrangements. I know Dr. Leon expressed interest in you and in TAXIR. I know very little more about the meeting except that Keith wanted us to work up our material on a wheat description bulletin and indicated his group would combine their input with ours. Seidewitz (German gene bank) was here for nearly a month working with us on the record concept--especially on the terms for the "dictionary" and its structure. We completed a draft of the proposal as applied to wheat and made a start on the application to barley and potatoes.

Our concept of the network of genetic resource information management systems and a description of principles of the dictionary as they relate to standardization, the sub-units, etc., will be reviewed at the Izmir program and I have hoped to cover a similar subject at the Rome meeting. I have no information as regards my travel to either meeting so am in much the same state of uncertainty as you, though I am making preparations in any case.

As to your talk, it seems to me that it would be appropriate that you cover in simple terms the principles of TAXIR and the use of it. You could give some Taxonomy illustrations and you or we or someone could demonstrate the application to descriptive data on genetic stocks. In this regard I know you can count on Sam Dietz and others here for cooperation.

We hope to revise the bean data file to reduce coding of terms and also to have some collection records on the system. We also have considered


Thanks for your letter of 29 November. I did not know that you had moved to California, and I wish you all luck in your new job.

Let me explain to you the origin of the proposal made by Jack Hawkes. Several months ago this Unit received a suggestion from an agricultural institute in Germany to organize a symposium on genetic information. For this purpose a budget was prepared and of course names of people with direct experience in the field were discussed. You, of course, were included and as this list was circulated for comments to several people, especially in the Eucarpia group, some of them understood that the meeting was an accomplished fact.

However, up to today, there has been no appropriation from the German Government, and according to some sources it will be difficult to obtain funds for the meeting, in spite of the interest and efforts of several German scientists. So in the case that the meeting is to be held, I will write to you immediately, as I need your suggestions on several aspects of the discussions. The place suggested for the meeting is FAO, Rome, and the tentative dates 6-9 April, that is before the Eucarpia meeting. In the event that the meeting is held, Eucarpia may have to cover the costs of your trip to Izmir, plus your per diem etc. there.

Don't get excited about the above address--I haven't changed jobs, but am here for a few months on leave from Boulder, where I'm still (hopefully) on the faculty.

Jack Hawkes' invitation to participate in the EUCARPIA meeting at Izmir, Turkey next spring was much appreciated, and I accepted, dependent on availability of travel funds. I assume you are definitely going, and that you have the funds in your budget for it.

What I wanted to do is to confer with you before submitting a title to Hawkes, and before preparing a paper. The question in my mind is "what level should I pitch my talk?" Will you be speaking about the data format, the data to be included, and its standardization? I suppose I should give a description of the TAXIR system, pitching it towards a general level rather than a group which has computer expertise. What do you think?

Jack Hawkes, University of Birmingham, has invited me to participate in the forthcoming meeting of Eucarpia (European Association for Research in Plant Breeding) in Izmir, Turkey, April 10-12. 
Dear Mr. Rogers:

Dear Jorge:

Sorry to hear the German funds were not forthcoming. That is typical these days, I suppose. Anyway, as mentioned in ~~xxxx~~ my letter to you on Feb. 14, my wife, Connie and I will be stopping in Rome anyway, and we can talk informally then, if that is helpful. Perhaps you have some friends in your computing center who would like to get some of the details of the programs for TAXIR.

Now that I know that the FAO meeting is off, I will schedule my visit to Rome after the Izmir meeting. I think we will leave Izmir on Friday, April 14th, and probably travel directly to Rome, and if the airline schedule permits, arrive in Rome the same day. I will tell you my exact plans when they are final. Connie and I will probably spend about a week in Rome, mostly as tourists.

I have mixed emotions about the CIAT work. No one on their staff is familiar with yuca, and I think that their plan is almost identical to plans they have used on other crops. I do not see much imagination in it.

As you may have heard, the yuca collection at Cali was nearly destroyed last September when a *Pseudomonas* disease attacked. I think they ~~will~~ claim to have saved about 1800 cultivars, but there is no prediction that the disease won't attack again. The collections are mostly from Colombia, some from Peru, Venezuela and from various countries in Central America. I do not think they used any plan in making the collection, but rather just went from farm to farm and collected things of different names. There is much duplication, and they have no organized way to sort them out. The agronomist in charge of the collection, R.L. Thompson seemed not to know how to proceed in a systematic way to determine the relationships between the cultivars, nor did he seem interested to have me work with him to do so. Their famed "Llanera" variety turns out to be a mix of varieties all from the llanos of eastern Colombia, not a single cultivar. They are somewhat embarrassed about the early publicity they generated about the variety, and now are saying the protein content is much lower in their earlier analyses claimed. It is my opinion that they are looking for another "IR-8" in yuca, that is a sort of magic bullet approach.

All together, I am disappointed in what they are doing, or plan to do. I do not like the way the Canadian money is allocated. I think cassava is in for a continued hard existence.

Dear Dave,

Thanks for your letter. On 3 February I wrote to you in California explaining that the meeting in Rome was cancelled. The idea to have this meeting originally came from a German institute, and they promised to support it. At the last moment this was not feasible and the meeting was called off.

Now the Izmir people had invited several scientists from the USA and Europe to a meeting which they are organizing to be held immediately after the planned meeting in Rome. As the latter was cancelled, now they are in very serious difficulties to support the travel of people they had already invited. In fact, even if the meeting in Rome had been held, they do not have the means to pay the travel Rome-Izmir and the per diem. At the moment all their efforts to find money have failed. FAO has nothing to do with this meeting, except that we are going to participate, but the financial condition here is so critical that we cannot help them in any way.

Although as said above, this office has nothing to do with the organization of the Izmir meeting, I am receiving other letters on this matter.

Now if you and Connie are coming to Rome anyway, we will be more than glad to see you and take you around.


