

Dear Dr. Rogers:

We are pleased to advise you that the X-ray plate and the ECG tracing reached us in time to be consolidated with the medical report and air-pouched today to Rome.

Recommendations from David J. Rogers for consultancy in FAO, Rome, for the Plant Production and Protection Division.

In order to meet the duties set forth in the Terms of Employment, the following activities are strongly recommended by the under-signed consultant.

1. Before proceeding to Rome:

- (a) Preparation of documents in support of the computer program, TAXIR. One week (40 hours) in Boulder, Colorado, will be required, from the time the contract is agreed upon. These documents, which will be needed in Rome, cannot be put into final form until the contract is signed.
- (b) Consult with various experts in (i) Pittsburgh, Penna., (ii) Washington, D.C., (iii) New York, N.Y., and (iv) Boston-Cambridge, Mass., for the purpose of determining the most recent advances (state of the art) in computer-based networks for documentation, as follows:
 - (i) Pittsburgh, Penna., Dr. Gilbert Daniels, Hunt Botanical Library, Carnegie-Mellon University, one day. Dr. Daniels has produced one of the most innovative computerized systems for dealing with complex literature retrieval.
 - (ii) Washington, D.C., The Office of Scientific Information Services, the National Science Foundation, and Office of Computer Systems, NASA, two days. The first-listed office has been the chief sponsor of computer networks for data retrieval in the United States, and has, therefore, more centralized knowledge of individuals and groups than any other single organization in the United States. The second-named organization, NASA, has had the longest experience with actual exchange of data by sophisticated inter-connected computer systems of any group known.
 - (iii) New York, N.Y., Dr. Louis Branscombe, Vice President for Research, International Business Machines Corporation, 2 days. Dr. Branscombe and his associates, as a vital part of the largest computing machine manufacturers in the world, can be of great assistance in developing the actual software packages simply because IBM machines are found in more localities around the world than any other. It is hoped that they can use their technical expertise with the various types of computers and make this expertise available at greatly reduced costs to FAO. Personal acquaintance with Dr. Branscombe should help in this matter.
 - (iv) Boston-Cambridge, Mass., Dr. Terry Winegradsky, Lincoln Laboratories, MIT, 2 days. This individual, and his associates in the Laboratory, comprise the leading group of scientists working on problems of information transfer.

2. Proceed directly to Rome from Boston, Massachusetts.

Recommendations (continued).

3. It is further recommended that two additional consultancies be established for personnel in the following categories, and that machinery for these be instituted immediately:

- (a) Computer expert with software of TAXIR. Mr. James Hanley, Programming Department, Computer Center, University of Colorado, Boulder, Colo. 80302. Mr. Hanley has been paid for the past three months to become thoroughly familiar with the workings of the system TAXIR. His knowledge will be absolutely essential to establish the system on the FAO computer in Rome, and to direct the establishment of the system in other locations as required by FAO.
- (b) Management scientist and systems analyst. Mr. Gilbert H. Hersh, Taximetrics Laboratory, Dept. of EPO Biology, University of Colorado, Boulder, Colo., 80302. For the development of documentation systems of the complexity envisioned by FAO, it is absolutely essential to employ the most cost/effective systems. Mr. Hersh is probably better trained in this type of work, and has more actual experience with documentation for genetic resources than any other single individual.

I make the above recommendations to produce the greatest benefit at the least cost.

Dear Mr. Rogers,

... In conformity with the telephone conversations you had yesterday and today with Mrs. McDaniel, we attach the Terms of Employment for the three-month consultancy in Rome, Italy, beginning about 7 January. You will want to review the terms of reference while we are checking with FAO Headquarters about the honorarium. Eventually the signed copy of the Terms should be returned to this office; the original is for your file. If an increase in the honorarium is authorized, an ink change can be made and the revision initialed in this office.

You indicated your passport is in order; your smallpox and cholera inoculations should be checked to ensure they are valid. No visa is required for entry into Italy on your U.S. passport.

The U.S. loyalty requirement for the consultancy has been met by our advising the Department of State of FAO's wish to have you proceed to Rome. However, for the longer assignment which you indicated is envisaged, a full field investigation is a requirement. The appropriate forms have been sent to you for completion before you proceed to Rome. Usually personal files are required to complete the forms which you might not have available if the execution is delayed until you reach Rome.

... Please complete and return the attached Designation of Beneficiary and Family Status forms. Although we require only a copy of your birth certificate now, you may wish to include copies of your dependents' certificates and the marriage certificate. These would be required for a longer assignment. In Rome you will be requested to complete the Declaration and Salary Allotment Instructions.

... For your information we attach the post report on Rome, Manual Sections 317, 342, 343 (Part 6), 344, and 345. Normally the decision about Group Life and Group Accident Insurance is delayed until briefing in Rome is undertaken. However, if the initial part of the assignment is undertaken at Boulder, you may wish to signify your wishes on the attached Adm. form 110.

The medical instructions are being sent separately by Special Delivery Airmail in the hope they will be available for the medical examination you have scheduled next week. The completed medical documentation should be airmailed immediately to this office for airpouching to Rome. Confirmation of the offer of employment is contingent upon



Dear Dave,

Thank you for your letter of 23 March. Do not be surprised if you see this letter posted in London. My son is going to England for a few days and I have given him this letter, as here there is a mail strike that we do not know how long will last.

First, on staff. There will be a secretary assigned full time to the officer in documentation. With reference to other staff, they may be hired as "consultants" on a temporary basis, but I hope we will have extra funds to have permanent assistants. This may come out of the TAC or UNEP funds (UNEP is the new organization: United Nations Environmental Programme).

Second, on travel. This will be done following the requests of the countries, and the priority activities.

Third and fourth. There are some funds, rather limited, in the regular programme of FAO, for computer time. Again, it is considered necessary here to have other supporting funds, and they have been included in the proposal to TAC and UNEP.

Fifth and sixth. I fully agree with your statements. My opinion is that documentation is going to be the key point in the coordination of the network of genetic centres. Quite possibly in the first year the demand in this aspect will be the most pressing job for you.

With reference to the budget, I think I gave you the figures for the next biennium. These are, more or less, \$30,000 for consultants, \$7,000 for travel, \$34,000 for computer time, etc. This is well below the \$100,000 per year of your estimation. However, in the proposal to TAC the figure I gave coincides with yours: \$100,000 per year.

SUBJECT: statement of personal policy associated with acceptance of contract with FAO.

I write to specify my conditions for work as Documentation Officer in FAO, AGPE. The following may be perfectly obvious as a condition of contract, but since I am now to FAO, it must be stated to satisfy my own fundamental belief in science, and to prevent any future misunderstanding. I have had sufficient experience as an administrator of scientific activity to recognize the need for understanding of the mutually acceptable conditions. This letter in no way alters the terms of the contract.

In general, my requirements for a scientific post are those that any honest scientist espouses: Objective analysis, free interchange of data and results, testing of hypotheses before acceptance or rejection, and revision of findings based on any new evidence, etc.

Specifically, with respect to the position as Documentation Officer, the following background of training, experience, and accomplishments must be understood. For all of my professional career of some 23 years after receipt of the PhD degree, my major objective has been to improve the capacity of agriculture to provide sufficient food for people of the world. I have studied one of the major food crops in the lowland tropics of the world, Manihot esculenta, and have produced a number of scientific papers on this subject, culminating in two major monographs, one of the entire genus Manihot and one of the species, M. esculenta. In addition, I have developed computer systems for the analysis of complex biological problems with a team of biologists, mathematicians, programmers and economic analysts of cost and effectiveness. Each of these systems was developed, and tested, before it was proclaimed useful to the scientific community. To provide a basis for continuing studies in complex biological systems, planning, and execution, I established the Taxinetics Laboratory at the University of Colorado to continue the work of research, development and implementation of computer-aided systems for agriculture and applied biology.

One of the major areas of concern in our work has been that of genetic resources, and we began (in addition to my own work with Manihot) to work with individuals and organizations responsible for large collections of genetic resources. Specifically, I have worked with the Ft. Collins National Food Storage Laboratory, both under its former director Dr. Edwin James, and with the present director, Dr. Louis Bass. I have also worked closely with Dr. Sam Dicks of the USDA Eastern Regional Center in Pullman, Washington, using our system TAXER for a large set of genetic resources. More recently, we have accomplished the first stage of pilot projects in genetic resources

documentation for Solanum, Zea mays, M. pr., Synsphaeria tetrasporobola, and other general crop lists, demonstrating the feasibility of the system to handle the varied types of data represented by each crop. I have, as a consultant, directed the establishment of the documentation function for the Lead Center.

Each of the above studies indicates a fundamental need for a very well defined management plan, and each demonstrates the great need for a team approach to the problem. Without a competent team, no activities in which I may participate will be successful.

These background statements indicate that first, an international organization, possibly within the FAO, ADP (with all its known faults and drawbacks) is absolutely essential to carry out the multitudinous tasks for a world-wide system. Furthermore, the background statements indicate that there is already a momentum established through the various studies and projects already initiated and that we must not lose this momentum, or we shall certainly fail in the eyes of many of our international colleagues. Significantly, all eyes are on the activities in which we participate, awaiting our actions.

These statements have the following implications for me, with respect to continued work in the FAO milieu:

- (1) As a scientist, I have a demonstrated record of achievement, which is important to me to continue;
- (2) I am dedicated to the idea that the documentation of genetic resources must be a multinational function, and on the basis of current evidence, probably under the auspices of FAO. This decision is made with full knowledge of the current difficulties within the organization.
- (3) Certain action programs must be initiated immediately, in order to provide the necessary complex documentation functions.
- (4) Provision for team functions is essential to accomplish the objectives listed in the terms of reference for the position of Documentation Officer.
- (5) If, upon examination both by the staff of FAO, and by me, there is found to be a failure to act on a necessary part of documentation development, I will notify the appropriate authority of my resignation from the organization, according to rules and guidelines of personnel procedure.
