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#### *About the Institute*

The Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation, a research division of Carnegie Mellon University, specializes in the history of botany and all aspects of plant science and serves the international scientific community through research and documentation. To this end, the Institute acquires and maintains authoritative collections of books, plant images, manuscripts, portraits and data files, and provides publications and other modes of information service. The Institute meets the reference needs of botanists, biologists, historians, conservationists, librarians, bibliographers and the public at large, especially those concerned with any aspect of the North American flora.

Hunt Institute was dedicated in 1961 as the Rachel McMasters Miller Hunt Botanical Library, an international center for bibliographical research and service in the interests of botany and horticulture, as well as a center for the study of all aspects of the history of the plant sciences. By 1971 the Library's activities had so diversified that the name was changed to Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation. Growth in collections and research projects led to the establishment of four programmatic departments: Archives, Art, Bibliography and the Library.

Thursday, Oct 27

Left Menan sometime after noon  
Rode to Idaho Falls & got train

North plate, Neb. Sun. Nov. 6<sup>th</sup>  
got here with sheep at 10.10 & they are being  
fed now. Fed last at Green River. Got there  
about 8.30 & away at 9.30. Went up to Y.M. &  
found I couldn't get out till 9.30 but managed.  
So went to sup. at Hank's Cafe. Had a big  
one. Saw crowd station and met nice  
young fellow - Gene Gunderson of  
Wyoming. address. 11 E. Pearson, Chi. Ill.  
we had a big time talking. I bought postage  
stamps from him so he could eat. (20¢)  
which we had 20¢ each. Then we slept till  
I left at 10. Saturday. Found 8 dead sheep.

Rolled into Rankings - then Larimore  
with 2 guys from prom, Ida. got in Sun.  
about 7.20 last night. ate sup. at Hyster's Cafe  
and got away at last with a mother guy  
for North plate. I was worn out. (changed at  
at Sydney) Here they recruited sheep then  
St. Joe (file 1). Jan. 24. In luck. Will be  
out by 3 o'clock Monday (12 hrs. yet). Might  
argue myself to get to show tonight. Will have  
to ship meals. get to Marquette & will feed  
you there tomorrow. or Hell. I guess.
