As you may know, Cash sisters married Reese brothers, and therefore there are quite a few "double cousins" in the family. I have tried to correlate the Reese Family History (3/22/1965) by adding the Reese numbers where possible.

A-1: HAMAN CASH. Born in the Revolutionary period in St. Clair, Belmont County, Ohio. Was a Quaker, and a farmer. Keeper of the St. Clair County Jail near Youngstown, Ohio in 1850s or 1860s. Married Sarah Selby.

B-5: BRICE SELBY CASH (A-1 Haman Cash). Born 3/11/1811 in Belmont County, Ohio. * He married Hannah Lillie (or Lily) Romans on 2/13/1834 at Stillwater, Belmont County, Ohio. He died 11/5/1887 at Troy, Kansas of sciatic rheumatism and is buried in Mt. Olive Cemetery, Troy, Kansas. Some notes say that Brice Selby Cash attended a medical college in Ohio and graduated. Practiced medicine in Ohio with his father, starting about 1830, until the Civil War.

Seeking the "Eldorado" which always seemed just ahead, he made many changes of location. He resided in Stillwater, Ohio several years; moved to Delaware, Delaware County, Ohio; to Moundsville, Marshall County, West Virginia; to Hutchinson, Marion County, West Virginia; to Dover, Tuscarawas County, Ohio; to Wegee, Belmont County, Ohio; to Holloway, Belmont County, Ohio; to Greenville, Darke County, Ohio; to Hollowayville, Bureau County, Illinois 1856; to Meppen, Calhoun County, Illinois; to Greenpond; to Troy, Kansas. At Troy he practiced medicine until the time of his death, thus covering a period of over 50 years. He had a town and country practice, and often was paid in garden produce. He was a Methodist, of Scottish descent, and licensed to preach. See Attached B-5.

Hannah Lillie Romans Cash was born at Wegee, Belmont County, Ohio, 10/28/1815. She died at Troy, Kansas 9/16/1891 and is buried with her husband in the Mt. Olive Cemetery at Troy. She was the daughter of Joseph L. Romans and Kesiah Ann Smith Romans.

Hannah's father, Joseph L. Romans, owned 600 acres at Stillwater, Ohio. Joseph Romans was the village blacksmith and lived in Chester County, Pennsylvania. He was a Quaker. There is a reference to a Joshua Romans in the 1790 Chester County, Pa. census. Some question: this could either be Joseph L. Romans' father, or could it be Joseph L. Romans himself by the name of "Joshua." Joseph L. Romans was born in Chester County, Pa., and is buried in the northwest part of that county at Belmont Ridge.

Hannah's mother, Kesiah Ann Smith Romans, was born in Chester County, Pa., and when 16 years of age was stolen by Indians. Joseph Romans, later her husband, followed with a party of friends, through Washington, Pa., Wheeling, W. Va., and down the Ohio River, to the fork of Willis Creek in Monroe Co., Ohio, finally overtaking them at the mouth of Captiva (Captina?) Creek, Ohio, 300 miles from home. She lived to the age of 99 yrs. 6 mos., and was buried with her husband, Joseph L. Romans, in Chester County, Pa. We do not know the names of Kesiah Ann Smith's parents, but she had a sister, Rebecca Smith who married --?-- Booker,

and a sister, Sallie Smith who married --?-- Springer, and a brother, Job Smith.

The children of Joseph Romans and Kesiah Ann Smith Romans were: Evan Fleming Romans; Harrison Romans, who once lived near Redfield, Kansas or Fort Scott, Kansas; and Phoebe Romans, who married Wm. Glendon and had 2 boys and 1 girl; and the above Hannah Lillie Romans, who married Brice Selby Cash.

OBITUARY.

Dr. B. S. Cash, who had been sick for almost three months, quietly passed away, Saturday evening, November 5th, 1887, aged 76 years, 7 months, 24 days.

The funeral, conducted by Rev. Pasley, of Severance, and Rev. Gage, of Troy, took place at the Methodist church, Monday afternoon, in the presence of a very large number of old friends and acquaintances; after which the remains were borne to the Troy cemetery, and laid to rest there.

Dr. Cash was born near St. Clairsville, Belmont county, Ohio, in the year 1811; was married at the age of 22 years, leading to the altar the lady who is now left to mourn his loss as a widow. He commenced the practice of medicine when about 30 years of age; moved with his family to Illinois in 1855, and from thence to Troy, Kansas, where for over 21 years he had made his home. He was converted and united with the M. E. church when 22 years old, and during the greater part of his life has been an official member, struggling—how hard only those know who knew him best—to live an exemplary christian life. He was always kind-hearted and generous, a loving and indulgent father, an ever affectionate and kind husband, and a friend always ready in time of need; ready in his professional character to minister to the poor as well as the rich, and to go through storm and tempest without murmuring. Those who knew him best, loved him most.

For nearly 54 years he and his faithful wife have traveled the rugged path of life together, and though now separated, they will without doubt soon be reunited on the other shore of the river of death, over which the husband has just crossed, and on the banks of which now stands the wife waiting her Master's summons to follow. Their family number ten, eight of whom are still living, and all married. All reside in Kansas except two, E. F. Cash, of Bel-lair, Ohio, and Mrs. Samuel Smith, of Kansas City, Mo. All were present at the funeral except two, who are invalids, and unable to leave their homes:

For the past three or four years the Doctor's health has been gradually failing, and his suffering during his last three months' sickness was very severe, yet through it all he manifested much christian patience. He very often in his rational moments expressed a great willingness to go whenever his Master called, and his perfect faith and trust in Christ, so often expressed, gives much consolation to those who so dearly loved him. The family, though bereaved, rejoice in the full belief that with the dear departed all is well.

Funeral Notice.

Died, at Troy, Kansas, Saturday evening, November 5, 1887, DR. B. S. CASH, aged 76 years, 7 months, 24 days.

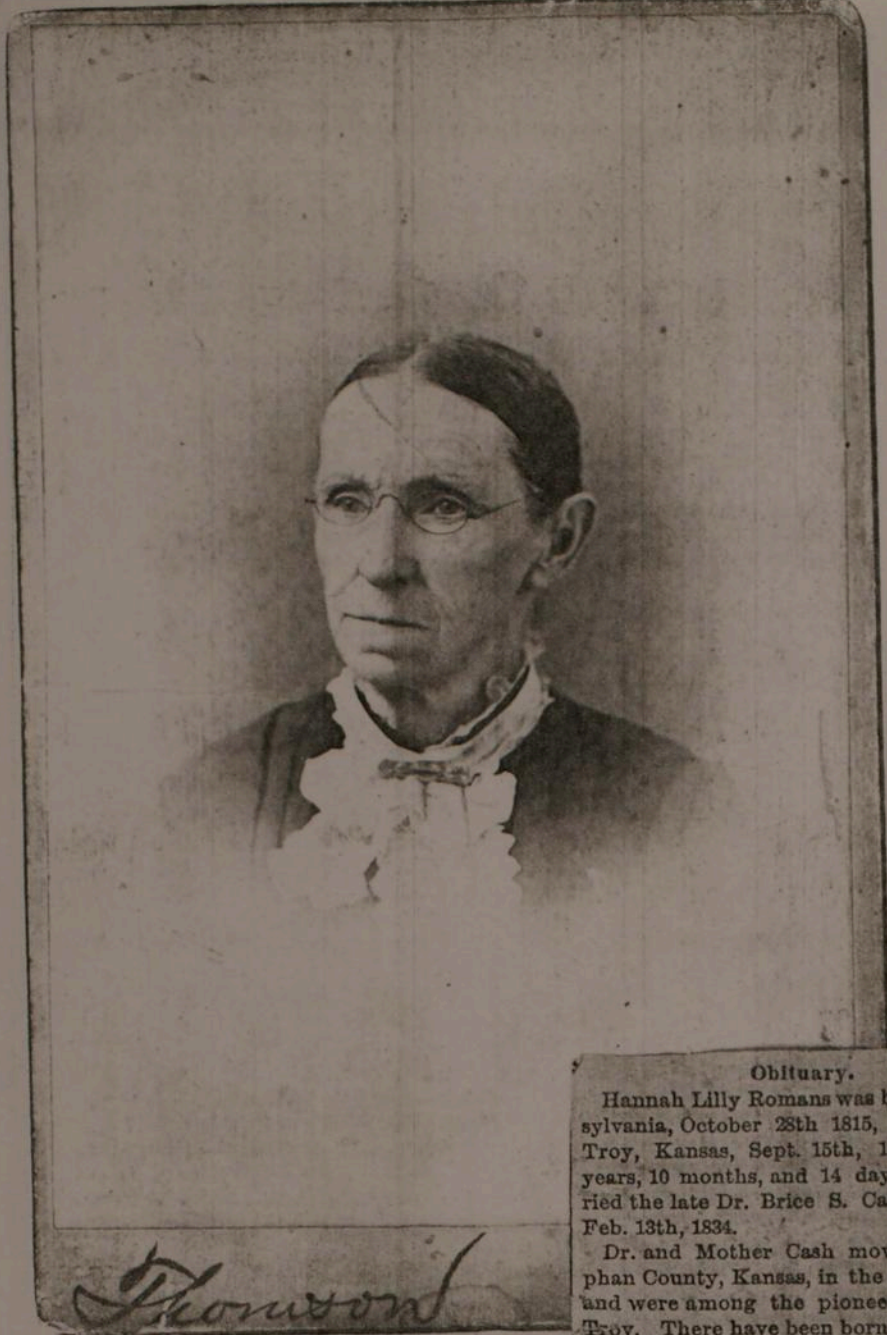

Obituary.

Hannah Lilly Romans was born in Pennsylvania, October 28th 1815, and died in Troy, Kansas, Sept. 15th, 1891, aged 75 years, 10 months, and 14 days. She married the late Dr. Brice S. Cash, in Ohio, Feb. 13th, 1834.

Dr. and Mother Cash moved to Doniphan County, Kansas, in the fall of 1865, and were among the pioneer settlers of Troy. There have been born to them six sons and four daughters. The husband, one son and four daughters have passed over death's river before her. There is one more of her family to welcome her to glory than there are to mourn for her here.

Mother Cash joined the Church in her sixteenth year, and for fifty-nine years she had been a useful, consistent and highly respected Christian lady. She was one of the charter members of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Troy.

During her last illness she suffered greatly, but was conscious until just a few moments before her death, and gave the fullest assurance that the love of Christ that had sustained her in life was her strength and solace in death. The tribute paid Mother Cash by her daughter Mary, who had constant charge of her during her long continued sickness—"Mother never complains"—better represents the patient, thoughtful Christian mother in Israel than anything we may add. Mother Cash was of a cheerful disposition, and her presence made the world brighter for every one who came into association with her. She was faithful to God, and died the death of the righteous.

Death of Evan F. Cash.

Mr. Evan F. Cash, a prominent and respected citizen of Mead township, died at his home last Sunday morning, aged 56 years. His disease was paralysis. Mr. Cash was a native of Belmont county, having been born in Flushing township, and his whole life was spent among us. In his earlier manhood, he engaged in teaching, and become among the foremost of Belmont county teachers. With what money he could save from the meager salary then paid to teachers, he took a course of study at Lebanon Normal School and Business College, and acquired a good literary and business education. About 1872 he abandoned teaching, and began a successful business career, first as Secretary of the National Glass Works of Bellaire, and afterward as the organizer and a member of the Buckeye Lantern Co., of the same city, which company was formed for the manufacture of a lantern of which he was the inventor, and patentee. He continued to work diligently in the interest of this company, until he was compelled by affliction to retire from business altogether, some two years ago. Mr. Cash was an affable, polished gentleman, generous, and kind to all, and very popular where he was best known. He had a high regard for the duties of citizenship, and a deep reverence for religious affairs. He was the counsellor of his neighborhood, the light of his home circle, and looked upon his family with more than a father's ordinary indulgence. His wife, a widowed daughter, Mrs. Day, and four sons, William B. late Clerk of Courts, McCune, Day, and Paul, all of whom are married except Paul, survive him, and to whom the sympathy of the whole community tend in their bereavement.

The funeral services were conducted at his late residence at 12 noon, on Tuesday. Interment at Old Weege Cemetery.

C-8: HARVEY ROMANS CASH (B-5 Brice Selby Cash, A-1 Haman Cash) Born at Stillwater, Belmont County, Ohio 4/19/1836, the son of Dr. Brice Selby Cash and Hannah Lillie Romans Cash. He enlisted as a volunteer soldier during the Civil War and served 3 years, enlisting at Sandusky, Huron County, Ohio. He was named and raised by Joseph Romans, his grandfather. He may have been a minister of the Christian Church. Was wounded at Pittsburgh Landing -- shot in the side and 3 ribs broken. Married Elizabeth Henderson 1/19/1863 at Washington, Pennsylvania. She was born in 1840 and died 2/26/1931. They resided in Turner, Kansas. He died 2/6/1929 and is buried at Highland Cemetery, Kansas City, Kansas. See Attached C-8 .

C-10. KESIAH ANN (KITTIIE) CASH REESE. (B-5 Brice Selby Cash, A-1 Hamon Cash)
Born Delaware, Delaware County Ohio 1/8/1841, the daughter of Brice Selby Cash
and Hannah Lillie Romans Cash. (~~One note says born Wolf River Township, Belmont
County, Ohio.~~) She died 12/24/1888 at Severance, Doniphan County, Kansas, and
is buried in Mt. Olive Cemetery, Troy, Kansas. She married David Reese in Troy,
Kansas 11/21/1867, the ceremony being performed by Reverend William Bishop. They
lived in Severance, Kansas. Kittie Reese's sister, Mary Lillie Cash (C-15), married
David Reese's brother, James Huston Reese.

David Reese was born in Montgomery County, Ohio on 4/27/1832 and died 9/30/1893.
He went to Kansas in 1856. In 1859, with brothers Samuel and George, and a Wm.
M. Baker from McCartysville, Ohio, David crossed the plains to about 35 miles
from Denver. David was a miner, a farmer, and a carpenter; a Presbyterian and
a Democrat. He went to California in the Gold Rush days, but did not strike it
rich and returned to Kansas. He did mine enough gold to make a wedding ring
worn by his wife, Kittie, by his daughter Emma (D-25), and by his great-granddaughter
Lucille (F-99). Also for a gold brooch owned by his granddaughter, Mary (E-62).
After the death of his wife, Kittie Cash Reese, David moved to a farm about 3
miles southeast of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma with his two younger children. This
was in the "rush" to the Cherokee Strip. There, in 1893, he was stricken with
paralysis and died about two weeks later on 9/30/1893, cause given as malaria.
His remains were taken to Troy, Kansas and the funeral was held at the residence
of his brother, James Reese (husband of Mary Lillie Cash Reese C-15). He is
buried in Mt. Olive Cemetery at Troy. He was a member of the Cumberland (Pres-
byterian) Church. At the time of his death he was survived by two daughters, one
son, four brothers and two sisters. (Funeral date 10/2/1893 2:00 P.M.).

After many unsuccessful attempts to gain their freedom, many tedious hours were whiled away by plotting and planning to escape and singing songs of Zion. They made friends among their enemies because of their cheerfulness and ability to entertain them with their songs. They finally escaped, and walking 300 miles through swamps and forests, reached the Union lines at Vicksburg.

He moved to Troy, Kansas shortly after the war, but returned to Calhoun Co. in about 1875. In 1884 or 1885 he came to Kansas City, Mo., following the building trade until within two years of his death.

From his obituary: Samuel Clinton Smith was a kind and affectionate father, possessing those attributes of character that inspired all that knew them with love and admiration. He and his wife, Julia Ann Elizabeth, celebrated their Golden Wedding Anniversary at their home, 3611 E. 26th St., Kansas City, Mo. 7/5/1913. Both belonged to the Methodist Episcopal Church.

Frederic Fleming Beale

1876-1948

was born in Troy, Kansas, June 13, 1876 and passed away in Caldwell, Idaho, February 16, 1948. He grew to manhood in the Midwest with a very pronounced interest in music. After extended study in Boston and in Chicago where he was a pupil in organ under Wilhelm Middelschulte, and in harmony, composition and orchestration under Adolph Weidig, he came to the Jesse L. Gaynor School of Music in St. Joseph, Mo., as the instructor in piano. There he met and was married to Mary Meyer, a pupil and later an associate instructor in the school.

After his marriage Mr. Beale went to Seattle, Washington as the head of the piano department and assistant director of music in the University of Washington. In 1911 the Beales came to Caldwell and established the Beale School of Music. In 1912 the late Dr. W. J. Boone, President of The College of Idaho persuaded the Beales to consolidate their School with the College, with which he was affiliated until his retirement a year ago.

For nearly forty years Mr. Beale has been closely identified with all that is finest in music in the Boise Valley—as an artist, a director, and as a composer. While with the College he directed some thirty noteworthy presentations, perhaps culminated with the presentation of "Fatima," his own composition presented in 1936. He helped in the organization of the Boise Community Concert and served on the Board of Directors from the beginning. He also contributed greatly to the success of the Boise Music Week, especially in the early years.

Mr. Beale's monthly concerts, extended over several years, given in the Methodist Church, are still well remembered. For thirty odd years he has been Director of Music and Organist of the First Methodist Church, and the past year his choir has been outstanding in its presentations each Sunday.

Mr. Beale's death on February 16, 1948 leaves a great gap in the community life he loved and served.

Well after so long a time I will try and drop you a few lines and say "Hello Bill." and say the time flies - 19 years, since I came thru Hiawatha. And I have made a good many tracks since '29 - spent 3 yrs. in Kansas City, Mo. - 12 years in Chicago - about 4 yrs. in Newton Falls, Ohio. I have three sisters living yet. Ola, Maggie & Hannah. I am the oldest of the family and I will be 77, Aug. 24th, 1948. Bill do you heard of any of our folks? that is grandfathers folks. that live in the southern part of this state, or any part of it. You know, you was born in Chicago, and Sherman was born in Ohio, and our great grandfather emigrated to the state, in the very early days, and our grandfather, was educated, attended a medical college and graduated in this state and practiced medicine in this state with his father, until the Civil war started -- then your father, and Uncle Flem, went into the Troy, Kan. & practiced medicine there the rest of his life, so if you have any record of any thing leading to the whereabouts of the Cash family please let me know. Dear Emma:

While I do not owe you a letter, I shall write you a few lines any way. Just finished writing Sherman a letter and am sending him a copy of our family data. I received such an interesting letter from him, right after Xmas., and never answered until today. I cannot write a letter, as I would like, so often I do not write at all. This is a gloomy day, raining and altogether disagreeable, in fact very much the same as when I last saw you. Yesterday was the same kind of a day only rained so hard I could not get out to Church, as I had intended. Even had my Sunday school lesson prepared. Lewis was in between trips and of course had to sleep.

Aunt Mary called me up during the day and said she was lonesome too. You knew that Jack had gone to Oklahoma, had something better offered him. Surely hope he does fine and makes good money. I am just holding my breath though, for fear he has them all move down there. It is perfectly natural for a man to want to be with his family. Beulah does not like Oklahoma, but of course like all dutiful wives will go when he says come. I saw them all at Church last Sunday a week ago.

I suppose you have been reading about the great discoveries in Egypt. When I saw the pictures of those wagon wheels and those chairs and chests they took out, it made me wonder if there was really anything new under the shining sun. Gives one a peculiar sense of nearness to the people of that period. To me Christ's time seemed to move up a thousand years closer. I was so afraid they were going to move the old King's body. It would seem to me that all historical relics lose a great part of their value when taken out of the setting in which they belong. When I first read about it I thought they ought to build a museum right around the tomb and leave the whole thing intact. Would it not have been a great drawing card for Egypt, as an attraction for tourists from all over the World?

Since I last wrote you and sent you the family data, I have been going to the library and have combed everything in the Genealogical Dept. but have found little to add to the data we have on my mother's side. I did however find my father's mother's family history back to the 15th Century. Grand ma Smith was a great grand daughter of Major General James Clinton, Patriot of the Revolutionary War. He was a member of the Legislature and of the Convention that adopted the Constitution of the U.S. His brother was the Vice Pres of the U.S. and his son DeWitt Clinton was the Gov. of N.Y. Being such a prominent family in N.Y., it was comparatively easy to trace the family back. I have our family record back to Henry 2nd. Earl of Lincoln, who was the Grandfather of our early ancestor William Clinton, without one missing link.

This record I have, makes Sadie, Ida and I eligible to the Society of the Daughters of the Revolution, 1790-1776. In the first Census taken of U.S. I find that in Chester Co. Pennsylvania, there lived a Joshua Romans and as the son of father's family was at that time under 16 years of age, there is no doubt that he was the father of Joseph, and that his son was Joseph. There was only one other Roman there and that was a Rebecca Romans and as she was listed as the head of the household, she must have been the widow and in all probability was the sister-in-law of Joshua Romans. I have not seen Uncle to ask him if he has the information handed down to him. There are no other Romans listed in the whole state. Makes me doubly sure this is another generation back of the Romans we are descended from, however we have not the record handed down, consequently we cannot state it positively.

We are working on an Easter Pageant, the story of the Crucifixion and the Resurrection. Lewis takes the part of Peter. I am glad I do not have a speaking part, it is bad enough to have to memorize all the music.

CHRISTMAS 1981

Dear Ones,

This has been a sad year for me with the loss of Lydia in April and my brother, Elmer, in July.

I started having my troubles by falling a few times and having to wait until someone found me. But all that is being taken care of now. I have a service called "Lifeline". That is a device about the size of a television remote control, that I carry on me at all times, while at home. When I fall, I push the button on "Lifeline" and that activates a signal to Memorial Hospital. They immediately telephone Lucille--if she is not home, they call Ed, if he is not home, they call the paramedics. So far Lucille has been home each time I've fallen, and I have not broken any bones.

The doctor at the VA Hospital decided I was falling because my legs had lost strength from lack of exercise, and ordered me on a physical rehabilitation program. I now go to the VA Hospital 3 days a week. I take a swim in the hot swimming pool (not whirlpool), in the morning, eat lunch, then work out in the gymnasium in the afternoon. In the picture with me in the pool is my physical therapist, Willie Royal. I get to and from the VA by riding "Dial-A-Lift".

When at home, I watch TV, listen to the radio or the tape recorder. I still have my cat, Mickey, for company. In cat years...he is the same age as I - 92 - neither one of us are in a hurry when we move around.

Right now I am recovering from a cataract operation on my left eye--performed on December 15th. They put in a permanent contact lens. Will let you know next year how successful the surgery was.

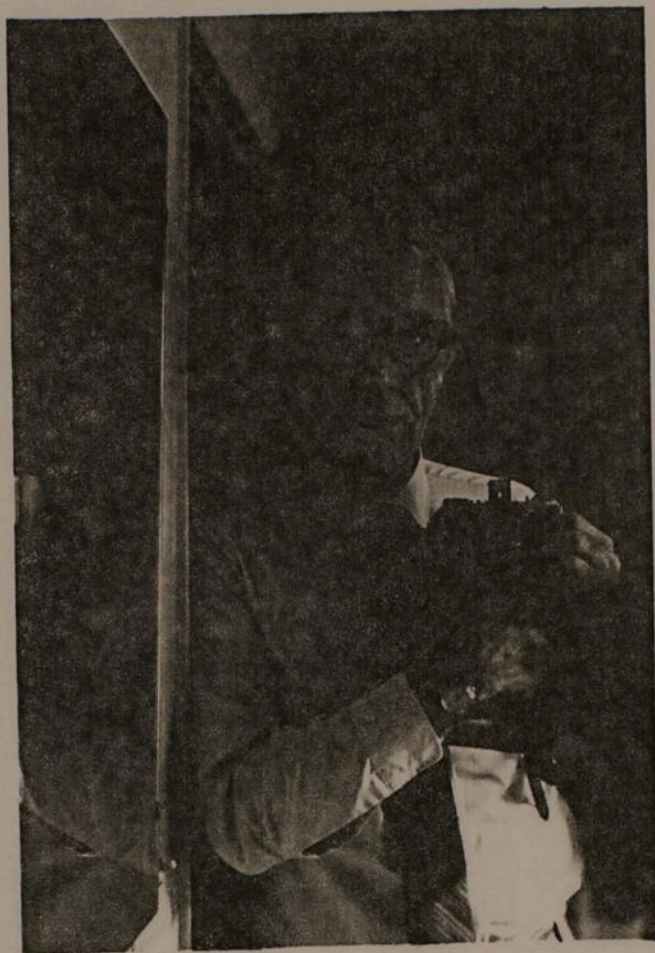

This is the first time I ever owned a share in anything larger than a Ford stationwagon or an old horse and I find it a little frightening. But it is good to have a place of one's own, with space for all my gear, a desk, bookcases and a wall for pictures.

About a year ago I went to work for an environmental firm to help out awhile. Today, I'm still there, helping out awhile. Mostly, I do field botany and write parts of technical reports. I enjoy the work and the dozen or so young people with whom I associate. In addition, I'm becoming a better botanist. Valeria is fine. She still works at the bank only five minutes drive from here. Water skiing in the summer and snow skiing in the winter keep her into activities with her family. Now she's into sewing, and with this house to look after, she'll never lack for something to do.

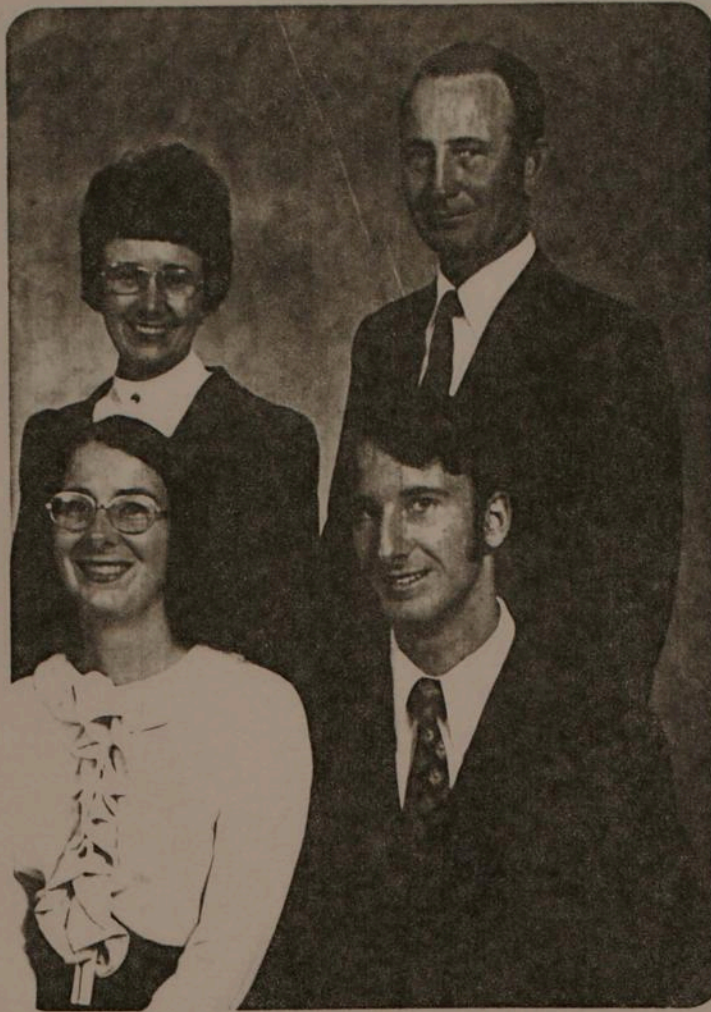
