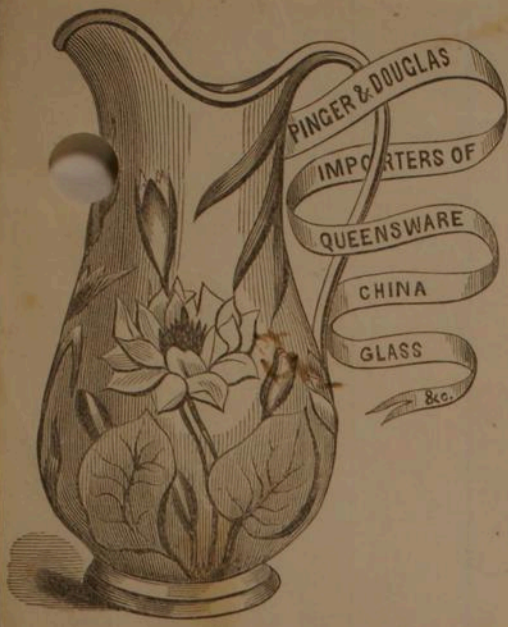

REESE FAMILY HISTORY

REGARDING THE NUMBERING SYSTEM USED IN THIS RECORD, I HAVE BEGUN WITH THE FIRST RECORDED ANCESTOR AS #1, AND HAVE NUMBERED HIS (#1) CHILDREN ON FROM THERE IN CONSECUTIVE ORDER, AND HAVE THEN TAKEN THE FIRST OF HIS (#2) CHILDREN THAT HAD A FAMILY AND HAVE CONTINUED THE NUMBERING OF THE CHILDREN IN TURN IN REGULAR ORDER.

BEFORE THE NAME OF EACH PERSON WHO HAS A FAMILY OR PERSONAL ACCOUNT UNDER HIS OWN NUMBER, I HAVE PLACED AN ASTERISK.

1. SAMUEL REESE. B. JANUARY 9, 1780, D. SEPTEMBER 17, 1847. SAMUEL REESE WAS BORN CLOSE TO LITTLE YORK, PENNSYLVANIA. HE IS SAID TO HAVE ATTENDED YALE UNIVERSITY; HOWEVER, A LETTER TO THE YALE UNIVERSITY LIBRARY IN 1930 FAILED TO LOCATE ANY SUCH STUDENT. HE TAUGHT SCHOOL FOR 45 YEARS. HE WAS A MEMBER OF THE METHODIST CHURCH. SAMUEL HAD THREE BROTHERS: JEREMIAH, DAVID, AND ONE WHO WENT TO VIRGINIA AND WAS NEVER HEARD FROM.

SAMUEL REESE WAS OF WELSH DESCENT. HE WAS A CRIPPLE. HE CAME TO MIAMI COUNTY, OHIO, CLOSE TO HYATSVILLE, AND THEN SETTLED ON THE REESE HOMESTEAD ONE MILE NORTH OF RUMLEY AND TEN MILES FROM SIDNEY, SHELBY COUNTY, OHIO. HE IS BURIED IN SIDNEY, OHIO. THE FIRST REESES WERE SLAVEHOLDERS.

SAMUEL MARRIED ELIZABETH HUGHEY (OR HUEY), WHO WAS BORN APRIL 12, 1796 NEAR LITTLE YORK, PENNSYLVANIA. SHE WAS A GREAT READER, A METHODIST, AND OF SWISS DESCENT. SHE DIED JANUARY 1, 1858 NEAR LINN CREEK, NEAR TOPEKA, KANSAS, AND WAS BURIED IN TOPEKA. (TOM DEAN (SEE #10) PUT STONE ON HER GRAVE.

JAMES MARRIED MARY LILLY CASH, WHO WAS BORN AT HOLLYVILLE, ILLINOIS IN [BUREN] COUNTY. SHE DIED NOVEMBER 22, 1932 AND IS ALSO BURIED AT MT. OLIVE CEMETERY IN TROY, KANSAS. QUOTING FROM THE TROY NEWSPAPER ON MRS. MARY LILLY CASH REESE: "...MRS. REESE WAS THE DAUGHTER OF DR. AND MRS. CASH, PIONEER PHYSICIAN HERE. SHE WAS BORN IN ILLINOIS AND CAME TO TROY WITH HER PARENTS IN 1865 WHEN SHE WAS NINE YEARS OLD. SHE MARRIED JAMES REESE OF TROY AND LIVED HERE UNTIL AFTER HIS DEATH. SINCE THEN SHE HAS RESIDED FOR THE MOST PART WITH HER CHILDREN. SHE SPENT LAST SUMMER WITH HER DAUGHTER, MRS. LILLIE BURKHALTER, IN SQUIRREL, IDAHO. SHE DIED AT THE HOME OF HER SON, WILLIAM G. REESE, IN KANSAS CITY. ANOTHER DAUGHTER, MRS. BEULAH REVEAL OF KANSAS CITY, AND A SISTER, MRS. VIOLA BEALE, OF CALDWELL, IDAHO, SURVIVE, ALSO TWO GRANDSONS, THE [TWIN SONS] OF MRS. REVEAL."

9. DAVID REESE. (SAMUEL I) DAVID WAS BORN IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY, OHIO ON APRIL 27, 1832 AND DIED SEPTEMBER 30, 1893. HE WENT TO KANSAS IN 1856. IN 1859, WITH BROTHERS SAMUEL AND GEORGE, AND A WM. M. BAKER FROM MCCARTYSVILLE, OHIO, DAVID CROSSED THE PLAINS TO ABOUT 35 MILES FROM DENVER. DAVID WAS A MINER, A FARMER AND A CARPENTER; A PRESBYTERIAN AND A DEMOCRAT. HE WENT TO * * CALIFORNIA IN THE GOLD RUSH DAYS, BUT DID NOT STRIKE IT RICH AND RETURNED TO KANSAS. HE DID MINE ENOUGH GOLD TO MAKE A WEDDING RING WORN BY HIS WIFE, KITTY, BY HIS DAUGHTER EMMA (#30), AND BY HIS GREAT-GRANDDAUGHTER LUCILLE (#135). HE ALSO MINED GOLD FOR A BROOCH NOW OWNED BY HIS GRANDDAUGHTER MARY (#81).

IN TROY, KANSAS ON NOVEMBER 21, 1867 HE MARRIED KESIAH ANN (KITTY) CASH, * THE CEREMONY BEING PERFORMED BY REVEREND WILLIAM BISHOP. THEY LIVED IN SEVERANCE, KANSAS. KITTY CASH WAS BORN IN DELAWARE COUNTY, OHIO ON JANUARY 8, 1841 AND DIED AT SEVERANCE, KANSAS DECEMBER 24, 1888. SHE IS BURIED AT MT. OLIVE CEMETERY IN TROY, KANSAS.

AFTER THE DEATH OF HIS WIFE, DAVID REESE MOVED TO A FARM ABOUT 3 MILES SOUTHEAST OF OKLAHOMA CITY, OKLAHOMA WITH HIS TWO YOUNGER CHILDREN. THIS WAS IN THE "RUSH" TO THE CHEROKEE STRIP. THERE, IN 1893, HE WAS STRICKEN WITH PARALYSIS AND DIED ABOUT TWO WEEKS LATER ON SEPTEMBER 30, 1893, CAUSE GIVEN AS MALARIA. HIS REMAINS WERE TAKEN TO TROY, KANSAS AND THE FUNERAL WAS HELD AT THE RESIDENCE OF HIS BROTHER, JAMES REESE. HE IS BURIED IN MT. OLIVE CEMETERY AT TROY. HE WAS A MEMBER OF THE CUMBERLAND (PRESBYTERIAN) CHURCH. AT THE TIME OF HIS DEATH HE WAS SURVIVED BY TWO DAUGHTERS, A SON, FOUR BROTHERS AND TWO SISTERS. (FUNERAL DATE OCTOBER 2, 1893 2:00 P.M.)

It is on Yellowstone NP property, having been condemned & purchased circa 1935. The Park Service removed everything.

11. GEORGE WASHINGTON REESE. (SAMUEL I) GEORGE WASHINGTON REESE WAS BORN OCTOBER 10, 1837 AT PIQUA, OHIO AND DIED MAY 20, 1913 AT ELECTRIC, OR GARDINER, MONTANA AND WAS BURIED AT LIVINGSTON, MONTANA IN THE MT. VIEW CEMETERY. GEORGE REESE MADE HIS FIRST TRIP TO MONTANA BEFORE THE CIVIL WAR, GOING TO VIRGINIA CITY BY MULE TEAM. HE RETURNED TO KANSAS IN 1861 AND JOINED THE SECOND KANSAS CAVALRY AND SERVED THROUGH THE FOUR YEARS OF THE WAR IN THE UNION ARMY. HE THEN DROVE FREIGHT TEAMS FROM KANSAS TO MONTANA FOR MANY YEARS, UNDERGOING THE TRYING AND DIFFICULT EXPERIENCES OF THE EARLY DAY PIONEER. IN THE 1870'S HE WAS SCOUTING FOR GENERAL HOWELL AND WAS ONE OF THE MOST VALUABLE SCOUTS FOR THE GOVERNMENT DURING THE CAMPAIGN AGAINST THE NEZ PERCE INDIANS. HE FOUGHT IN MANY BATTLES AGAINST THE INDIANS IN MONTANA. HE SETTLED ON A RANCH AT ELECTRIC, MONTANA IN 1874. HE WAS ONE OF THE FIRST GUIDES THROUGH YELLOWSTONE PARK AND SERVED FOR MANY YEARS AS A GUIDE. HE WAS ONE OF THE BEST-KNOWN PIONEERS OF PARK COUNTY AND DID MUCH TO BRING PARK COUNTY TO THE FRONT AND CHANGE IT FROM THE WILD, WESTERN COUNTRY TO A STATE OF ADVANCEMENT AND CULTIVATION.

GEORGE REESE MARRIED LIBBY _____ IN 1884.*

GEORGE DIED MAY 20, 1913 AT HIS RANCH AND THE FUNERAL WAS HELD AT HIS HOME ON MAY 22, 1913, THE SERVICES BEING CONDUCTED BY REVEREND C. P. BURNETT OF THE LIVINGSTON EPISCOPAL CHURCH. THE REMAINS WERE TAKEN TO LIVINGSTON ON THE PARK TRAIN, AND THE FARRAGUT POST, GRAND ARMY OF THE REPUBLIC HAD CHARGE OF THE SERVICES AT MT. VIEW CEMETERY. HE WAS 75 YEARS OF AGE.

Notes on Brice Selby Cash --father of Maryy Lilly Cash Reese  
and Kesiah Anne (Kitty) Cash Reese.

Kesiah (Kitty) Cash and David Reese were married at Troy,  
Kansas, 27 November, 1867. In 1872 or 1873, his brother James  
Huey Reese (6) married the sister of Kitty, Mary Lily Cash.  
Census records have provided some information about the Cash  
family in addition to that given in the Reese Family History  
distributed by Mary Bierer Shannon 22 March, 1965.

CASH The 1840 Census Record for Ohio, lists B. S. Cash in Dela-  
ware Co., Troy Tsp. Kesiah was born there in 1841.

Absent from the 1860 Illinois census are the four older  
children, including Kesiah; also missing is the baby Latitus  
and the young lady, Heather. The family apparently lived  
in the town of Hallowayville which appears on old atlases.

In 1865, or 1866, the Cash family moved to Troy, Doniphan  
Co., Kansas. I recall some things my grandmother, Mary, told  
me about the journey: She traveled with her father--apparent-  
ly just the two of them--in a light wagon, staying overnight in  
farm homes along the way where they got food and lodging. Be-  
cause the issues of the civil war were still strong, and because  
they traveled through a region of mixed sympathies, her father  
had to assess the attitude of the people they encountered and  
profess to be either Northern or Southern to fit the need of the  
moment in order to assure a friendly host.

REESE

Grandmother said she had three brothers with the Northern forces in the Civil War. One was captured and held in prison from which he managed an escape. Another was drowned in the Mississippi River in a military engagement. The third brother was a bugler for General Sherman on his march to the sea. He was so fond of the General and so proud of his assignment that he named a son Sherman who I remember from my early youth. Grandmother had her brother's bugle and cavalry sabre which she kept hidden in her bedding. One of my earliest memories is being kept from playing with the bugle & sabre. These treasures were lost along with many others, including the family bible, thick albums of family tin-types and other early photographs, when my family lost most of their possessions during the Great Depression of the early 1930's. (Note: see addendum on page 3)

CASH

I have no recollection of what brought them to Troy, Kansas, but my guess is that Brice S. Cash came to practice medicine in a locality that was in need of doctors.

The 1880 Census for Troy, Doniphan Co. lists the Cash family as follows (page 11):

The above people, of course, are my grandfather James Reese, (6) in the Reese History, Mary Lilly Cash, Lillian May Reese (23), and William Reese (24). This was 7 years before my mother Beulah Dean Reese (25) was born.

The Reese history does not give a date for James and Mary's wedding. But my Grandmother said she was married at age 16, which would have been 1873. James Reese would then have been 49 years old, 33 years her senior.

I have no clues as to the identity of Brice S. Cash's parents. However, the Census Indexes lists some additional Cash names:

Some notes about James H. Reese (6)

Until I was about 14, I probably spent more time with my grandmother--Mary Lilly Cash Reese--~~than any other grownup~~. From her I learned something about my grandfather James Reese of which I recall the following:

My grandmother did all the household ironing with a hand-iron she heated on top of the stove. Part of her ironing equipment was a cloth pad soaked--or rather, caked--with beeswax. She kept the shoe of her irons slick and shining by running their hot surface over the beeswax pad. I liked the odor of hot beeswax and would sometimes swipe a small ball of the pure wax for chewing gum. But the fascinating thing about the beeswax pad was its insides. If you unfolded the wax-soaked pad there was a small black leather-bound notebook-- one my grandfather carried to California and back. A sort of diary. The pages were sort of brittle and yellow with age and wax and heat, and the handwritten word faint. The only thing that I remember of its contents is that ~~is that~~ of items purchased--lists of things. The really important thing about the notebook was that it represented a trip to the "gold mines" of "California" that my grandfather made, according to my grandmother.

The Reese history paragraphs for David (9) and George (11) indicates that both made journeys west to Colorado, California and Montana, in George's case. I am reasonably sure that James Reese went to California with David, and seem to remember that my grandmother said he went with brothers. Furthermore, James, like David, brought home enough gold to make my grandmother's wedding band. (He was a jeweler.) I wanted the ring so badly because of that and my grandmother promised that I could have it when she died. But no one would take it from her in the end and she was buried with it.

My grandmother said that James Reese and the others he was with on the California trip stayed overwinter at Salt Lake City. But Arlene Hadfield Reveal's family could find no record of them having been there the winter of 1849-50, the time they were said to be there. Whatever the experience, James came away with a unfavorable view of Mormon women and biased my poor

grandmother so

grandmother so badly that she used to plead with me to stay away from Mormon girls in Idaho. She died several years before I married Arlene who came from a fine Mormon family. Had she lived she might have changed her mind.

Grandmother Reese also said that James also drove wagon teams, and I seem to recall it was in Colorado. Another thing that comes to mind is that Grandfather Reese's diary had some notations about mining claims, but I am not sure.

I feel sad that I do not know more about James Reese and what he did before he married the 16-year-old Mary Cash at the age of 49. Certainly it would not be without interest.

My grandmother always referred to him as "Mister Reese" and that seems to say something.

Notes on George Washington Reese. (11)

While searching through some Yellowstone National Park material from some reference to George Reese, I found the creek named for him. (See Report of the Secretary of the Interior-- Yellowstone Nat. Park 5th annual Report, P. W. Norris, Superintendent - December 1, 1881 - F722 Y4 , page 779) The name Reese Creek appears on a sketch for a driveway for game, but does not show the Reese house or other improvements in place at the time. Later, I found the designation "Reese Creek" on the old topo map for Yellowstone N. P.

With this information in hand, I visited the locality in the summer of 1978. Inquiry led me to the home of Tony and Agnes (nee Ribe) Stermitz on the highway a mile or so north of Gardiner (and across the Yellowstone River from the old RR terminal called Electric, a shipping point for the mining town of Aldrich up-canyon to the northwest.) From them I learned something of George Reese and his family:

Agnes Stermitz--a hardy, trim woman of 76--grew up in area along with husband Tony, age 80. When a young girl, she worked for George's ~~get~~ eldest son, James George Reese (47), and got so attached to the old Reese homestead that she made up her mind as a young girl to someday own the place. Her dream finally came through. She and Tony bought the place in the early 1920's when James (Jim) Reese moved away, presumably to Utah. They made it their home until the National Park Service took the property by condemnation in the mid-1930's.

They related that George was known as "Old Man Reese" to people of their generation. He was one of the oldest inhabitants of the area and one of its earliest settlers. Tony related that once, shortly after old George began homesteading there, he looked out one morning and saw a couple of riders on a distant ridge which he took to be Indians. Montana, Wyoming and the Dakotas at that time (the mid-1870's) were in the midst of the Indian Wars, and George was always on the alert for hostiles. So without

delay he takes some food, a canteen and a rifle from his house, wades across the Yellowstone River and climbs to a sheltering rock (a cave?) on the hillside. Tom Stermitz said he could show the place to me where Old Man Reese found a safe retreat. I wish now I'd asked him to do so.

George married a young lady when he was 47--1884 according to the Reese Family history. Not too long after their third child was born in 1894, she ran away, leaving George to raise the family. Mrs. Stermitz said the wife's name was Arminda. George and she built their "first home" in 1885. (This is the place the Park Service tore down when they seized the property.) George did no farming; rather, he rented the land out and evidently made a living hauling mail and passengers between Electric (the rail head) and the mining town of Aldrich, where coal was mined for making coke for use in Montana's smelters. George also taught Sunday school, Mrs. Stermitz said, coming to the school to pick up the children. I got the impression he took them some distance to a church, possibly to Aldrich.

Apparently after George's death in 1913, the son James George Reese (47) came back to run the home place. Mrs. Stermitz said he was "an office worker", so possibly he worked for the coke company in Electric, later moving to Hiawatha, Utah. She said his wife Maggie was born in Aldrich, but the History says she was born in Streeter, Illinois, which is probably correct.

Mrs. Stermitz showed me a decorative dish which was given to her old George. She also showed me a local history book in which he appeared in one of the photographs. The book is a pictorial history of Aldrich and Electric written by Bill and Doris Whithorn.

Mrs. Stermitz said James and Maggie Reese had six children. Our family history lists seven. This might mean that the last child, born in 1925, came along after the family left the home place and after Mrs. Stermitz terminated her work for the family, at which time she was 21-or-so years old.

I neglected to mention on page 5, above, a map which shows Reese ranch. This map accompanies the "Report of Lt. General Sheridan of an Expedition through the Big Horn Mountains, Yellowstone National Park, etc., dated September 20, 1881. The name Reese appears along with a small square indicating a building or place a short distance downstream from where "Tom Moore Creek" enters the Yellowstone, and beside the old wagon road. I believe the name is mis-located and should have been placed alongside another small square shown where Reese Creek (unnamed on this map) is located, some distance upsteam near Electric Peak.

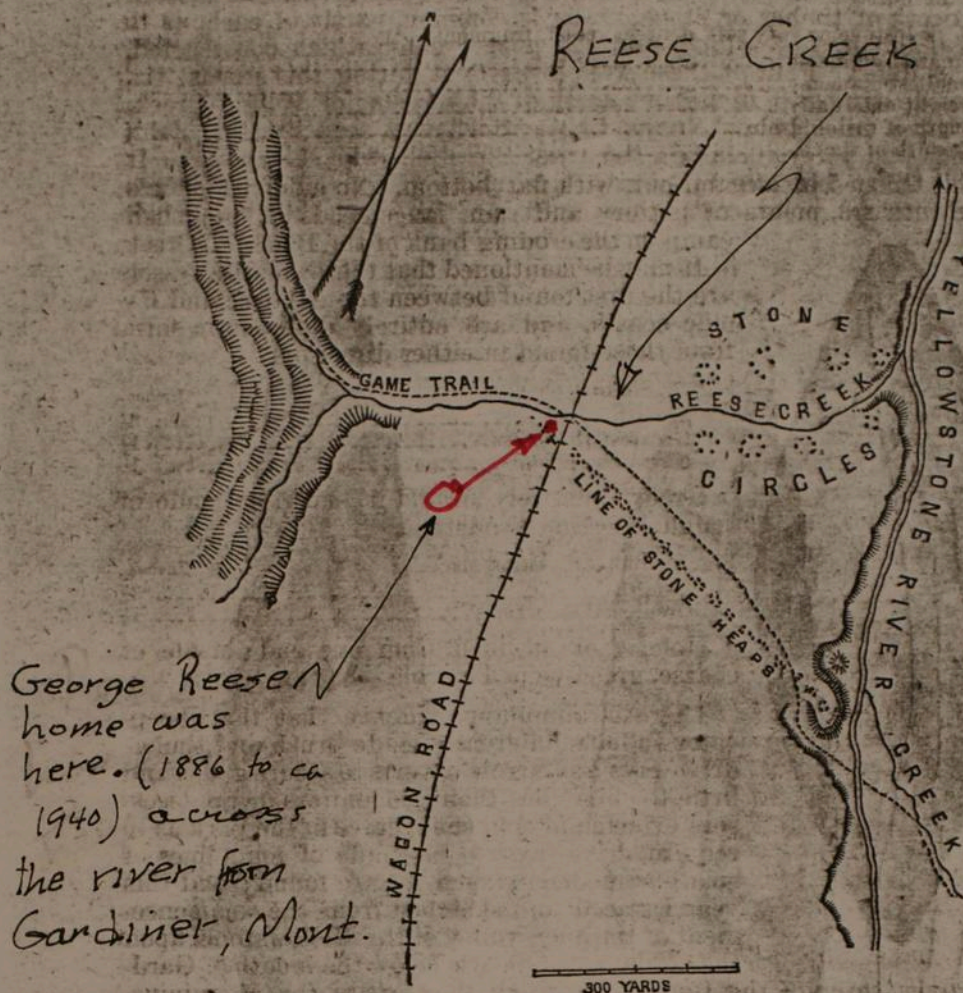


FIG. 9.—Driveway for game.

neither, are questions better understood with exploration and research in that direction, which I have commenced and hope may be continued.

INDIAN REMAINS.

These are, first, of the various kinds usually found in regions until recently only occasionally visited rather than inhabited by the nomadic hunter tribes, such as trails, lodge-poles, brush wick-e-ups, peeling of timber, and rude storm or timber wind-brakes upon commanding sites or narrow passes, for observation, ambush, or for protection from their enemies or the elements, as well as rude stone axes, or flint or obsidian knives, lance and arrow heads and scrapers; and, second, those pertaining to the timid Sheepeater occupants, such as remains of camp-fires in the secluded glens or cañons, and occasionally in caves or niches in

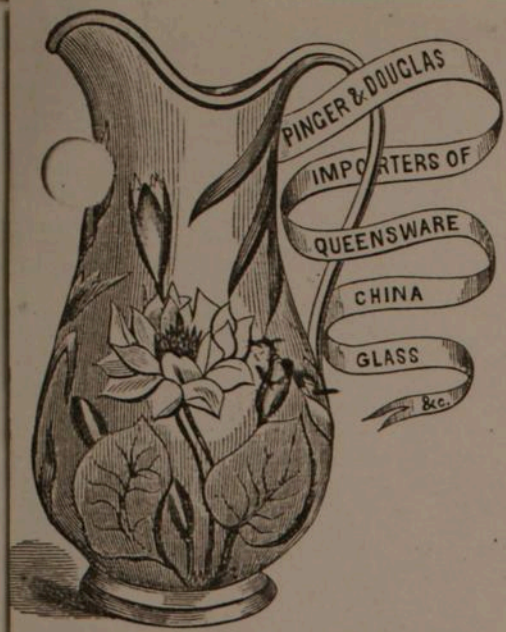

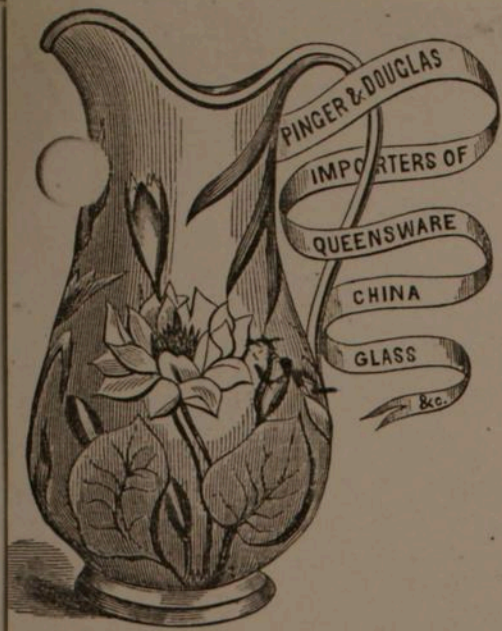
