



Dear Dr. Roberts:

Your specimens arrived the other day, and your covering letter of the 2nd today, in regard to the morels you sent for confirmation of identification. I knew they were on their way since I had spoken to Bernie Lowy on the phone not long before, and the point came up.

You'll perhaps be disappointed to learn that I have serious doubts about what species of morels occur in this country. I am currently of the opinion that we have but three: the common Morchella esculenta (which is what I'd call all 3 you sent, and which would then include M. deliciosa, M. conica, and M. crassipes as mere growth forms of it), the black-edge pitted species which maybe should be called M. angusticeps (but quite possibly the European name, M. distans, is more correct), and the half-free morel, M. semilibera (= M. hybrida). My conclusions are based on many years of struggling with the "microspecies" recognized by authors like Boudier (and, indeed, Seaver), and on unpublished data generated by my former student, Lekh Batra, in Kansas, but most of all on the paper by Groves and Hoare (Canad. Field-Naturalist 67: 95-102. 1953) which details their studies of colonies over time, during which specimens changed from one morphological "species" to the next to the next, getting larger and larger, and with ascospores similarly increasing in size over time!

I'll return your specimens under separate cover.

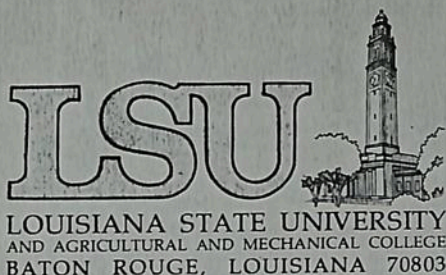


Thank you for submitting your manuscript to MYCOTAXON. It has been safely received here.

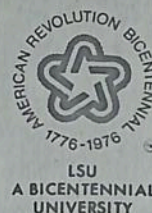

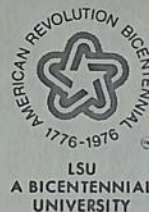
If there are 30 reprints with covers that have been overlooked, please send them. If there are no others, please make an adjustment in the bill, which I have not yet received.
