INSTRUCTIONS CONCERNING ACADEMIC PERSONNEL REPORTS

THE DEFINITIONS, DESCRIPTIONS, AND ILLUSTRATIONS WHICH FOLLOW ARE DESIGNED TO HELP IN COMPLETING THE REPORT. PLEASE READ THEM CAREFULLY.

The Academic Personnel Report is to be completed by all members of the Faculty (teaching or research) except Library personnel. All graduate assistants are also to submit a report. In addition, any other member of the staff who teaches a class(es) is to submit a report. The instructor's copy (green form) can be used as a worksheet, if necessary.

All professional activities should be reported in terms of hours and percentage of University time per week devoted to various functions. The "week" is a typical or average week which would be representative of the amount of time devoted to each activity during the reporting period. Hours and percentages should be in whole units only. Percentages must add to 100 percent regardless of the percent of appointment.

If additional space is needed to answer any of the questions on this report, enter the number and letter of the question(s) and the description in the "Remarks" section or on a separate sheet of paper and attach it to the report. Be sure to include the average number of hours per week and percent of time spent in such activities.

Since the data from the academic personnel report is keypunched and processed by the computer, it is important that: (1) data inserted on the form be handwritten and (2) any changes made to the pre-printed social security number should be made so the incorrect number is still legible.

I. PERSONAL DATA

Please check this section for accuracy and insert data that were not pre-printed by the computer. All blanks must be coded.

Percent of Appointment: Indicate 100% if full-time, 50% if half-time, etc.

Pay Basis: The numeric code was obtained from the payroll file and represents contractual arrangements regarding period of appointment and pay distribution.

Rank: General title codes for the various ranks are shown below. The third and fourth positions for professors, associate professors, and assistant professors are shown as dashes because they provide specific position title identity and involve 22 possible title codes.

Sex: Indicate as M (male) or F (female).

Title: Indicate Professor, Associate Professor, Director and Professor, etc.

Years Experience: Show only full-time teaching or research in institutions of higher education (excluding fractions). Teaching as a graduate assistant is not to be included. If you have no years experience insert a zero in each field.

1.0 INSTRUCTION

This category includes all activities which are part of the institution's instructional program. Departmental research and public service which are not separately budgeted are included in Instruction. (See Section 1.4) Academic administration at the dean's level is excluded, but administration at the departmental level is included in Section 1.5.

1.1 Direct Teaching Activity: Pre-printed in this section are the course(s) for which you have teaching responsibility, including 8000 and 9000 level courses. The data for 8000 and 9000 level courses reflects the total students for whom you are responsible and the average credit hours for which each has registered. This information was submitted by department heads earlier this session. Check the pre-printed information for accuracy and completeness. Make necessary corrections concerning this information. Delete courses by drawing a line through them. For reporting other time devoted to 8000 and 9000 level courses, see Section 1.2, "Supervision of Instruction."

HEGIS Number: This is a 4-digit number for academic subdivisions of knowledge and training taken from "A Taxonomy of Instructional Programs in Higher Education." If the HEGIS number is not pre-printed, leave the field blank.

Department, Course and Section Number: Show department abbreviation, course number, and section. Only one course per line can be shown. No more than 6 courses are allowed per APR. If more than 6 courses are being taught, attach a second APR showing those courses, if one has not been pre-printed.

Credit Hours: If instruction is not shared, the figure representing credit hours should be the total credit hours a student earns for the course. If it is a multiple instructor course or if the instruction is shared, including graduate assistants, then the total credit hours must be allocated among the faculty members reporting the course. The credit hours as shown for each course and section were supplied by department heads on the "Faculty Assignment Report". They indicated on this report the credit hours taught by each faculty member in Multiple Instructor Courses.

Type Section: Should be either lecture (LECT), laboratory (LAB), individual (IND), research (RES), seminar (SEM), or recitation (REC).

Multiple Instructor Courses: If the pre-printed course data does not reflect the shared credit hours correctly or if a multiple course was not printed, check with the department head in order to properly reflect the assignment. The following is an example of how it should be reported.

When two or more instructors (including graduate assistants), share in the instruction of a course, each instructor should share in the credit hours produced. For example, a three (3) hour course comprised of two (2) hours of lecture and two (2) hours of lab instruction which is taught at different times by two different instructors with ten (10) students enrolled will produce a total of 30 SCH's. The instructor teaching the lecture should show on his report two (2) credit hours for the lecture part of the course with ten (10) students enrolled, and the instructor teaching the lab should show one (1) credit hour for the lab part of the course with ten (10) students enrolled.

If two (2) graduate assistants equally teach the lab portion of the course they should each show .5 credit hour value for the course with ten (10) students enrolled.

Variable Credit Courses: In the case of variable credit courses, such as 8000 and 9000 level, information obtained from "Faculty Assignment Forms" for these courses was summarized and appears on the APR as such. For example, if a faculty member was shown to be directing the research of three students enrolled at the 8000 level and these students were enrolled for 3, 6, and 9 hours respectively, his APR would show one 8000 level course with 3 students enrolled for 6 hours of credit which is the average of 3, 6, and 9. Thus  $(3 \times 6)$  18 student credit hours would be generated, the same as  $3 + 6 + 9 = 18$ . See Section 1.2 for explanation of other time spent with graduate students.

Number Enrolled: The number enrolled is as of the 14th day of classes. In lecture-lab courses, the number enrolled in the lab(s) should equal the number enrolled in the lecture. Do not change the number enrolled as shown unless the section has been split, or for some other similar reason.

Contact Hours/Week: The figure to be entered should represent the actual number of clock hours you meet the class per week in each course. No preparation time should be reported here. The "Total University Time" column should include the number of hours and percentage of time you meet the class, preparation time, grading papers, etc.

Names of Other Faculty Who Assist: If the course is a multiple instructor course, list the faculty member(s) involved.

Total University Time: Report in this section direct instruction, paper grading, preparation, evaluating students, counseling students enrolled in the course, the time you meet the class, etc. Please report hours and percentages in whole numbers.

Graduate Assistants: Graduate assistants and others who do not teach but have responsibilities related to instruction, such as grading papers, checking class rolls, etc. should report the HEGIS number (if known), the department, course(s), and section number(s) and a figure for hours and % in the "Total University Time" column. Use one line on the form for each course reported. Do not fill in the Credit Hours, Type Section Number Enrolled, Contact Hours/Week, and Name of the Faculty Who Assist fields, if you are not teaching. Graduate assistants who perform departmental administrative duties are to report their duties and time in part 1.5 "Instructional Support Activity."

1.2 Supervision of Instruction: Include in this section time spent supervising laboratories, special areas such as freshmen English, managing a language laboratory, supervising student teachers, etc. This category also includes supervision of theses and dissertations. If you can determine the HEGIS number fill in that field, otherwise leave it blank.

1.3 Extramural Teaching-Community Education: Show in this section any course(s) which you teach through Correspondence Study or Extramural Teaching. Resident credit courses taught off campus are to be included in this section if these courses are taught on an overload basis. Do not report your time in the "Total University Time" column. You need not provide a HEGIS number for these courses.

1.4 Departmental Research-Scholarly Activity: Time is to be reported in this category if the faculty member has been given released time from teaching or if it is part of the faculty member's regularly assigned duties and the salary is not budgeted to a separate research account. This section includes departmental research and other scholarly activities such as preparing art exhibitions, concerts, recitals, and the like. Provide a brief descriptive title of the project area or activity.

1.5 Instructional Support: This section includes time for departmental administration, preparation of new courses and curricula when this is a departmental assignment, giving seminars not reported in "Direct Teaching Activity," being a guest lecturer in another faculty member's class, and other instructional activities which do not logically fit in categories 1.1 through 1.4. Also, graduate assistants and others who do not teach but have administrative responsibilities related to instruction should identify those duties and report a figure in the "Total University Time" column.

NOTE: Total the figures in 1.1 through 1.5 and show in block labeled "Total University Time in Instruction."

## 2.0 SEPARATELY BUDGETED RESEARCH

Report time in this area only if part of the faculty member's salary is budgeted to a specific research budget. This category includes internally supported research programs as well as sponsored research. Indicate the project area under investigation, the source of funds, and the agency or agencies sponsoring the project. Provide a brief descriptive title of the project area. Examples of project titles reported to the Board of Regents in 1975 were: Laser-Induced Chemical Reactions; An Experiment with a Competency-Based Teacher Education Program; Research in Classical Theory of Quadratic Forms; The Impact of Product Recalls on Consumer Behavior. The time spent in the administration or supervision of research projects should be reported in this section.

## 3.0 - 7.0 OTHER BUDGETED ACTIVITIES

Report time in these sections only if this is a part of the regular University assignment and the salary is so charged. For example, if the Director of Continuing Education is teaching an Accounting course, part of his time would be shown in 1.1 (Direct Teaching Activity) and the remainder in 3.0 (Public Service). If the Associate Dean of Arts and Sciences is teaching an English course, part of his time would be reported in 1.1 (Direct Teaching Activity) and the remainder in 4.0 (Academic Support). Indicate the "Other Budgeted Activities" which apply, specify the activity in the space provided and show the time in the right-hand column.

A description of "Other Budgeted Activities" categories follows.

### 3.0 PUBLIC SERVICE

This includes activities established primarily to provide services beneficial to groups external to the institution. These activities include seminars, projects, workshops, short courses, etc. established to provide the public the various unique resources and capabilities of higher education. For example, faculty members cross-charged to Cooperative Extension, Continuing Education, Journalism Extension, etc. would report time in this category.

### 4.0 ACADEMIC SUPPORT

Included here are organizational units which provide support services which are an integral part of instruction, research, and public service. Included in this area are: dean's offices, libraries, University Press, museums and galleries, audio-visual services, computing support, laboratory schools, and course and curricular development which is specifically budgeted. Departmental administration is not included here, but in 1.5 (Instructional Support).

### 5.0 STUDENT SERVICE

Included in this area are admissions, registrar activities and other activities which contribute to the student's emotional and physical well-being and to their intellectual, cultural, and social development outside the context of the formal instructional program. Includes such things as intramural and intercollegiate athletics, counseling and career guidance, financial aid, student health services, etc.

### 6.0 INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT

This category includes those activities designed to provide operational support for the day to day functioning of the institution. This category is comprised of the following: executive management, fiscal operations, general administrative services, logistical services and community relations. Faculty personnel in general administrative offices would report time in this category. Departmental administration should be reported in 1.5 and college administration should be reported in 4.0.

### 7.0 INDEPENDENT OPERATIONS

This category includes independent operations located on the campus. Included would be USDA, U.S. Department of Interior, or state agency employees who have gratis appointments on the faculty or staff and who teach courses or direct student research.

### 8.0 NON-BUDGETED ACTIVITIES

This category includes any University activities which are not budgeted nor do not fit in any of the other categories. Professional organizations and Committee assignments, other than courses & curriculum, should be reported here. Report courses & curriculum type committee assignments in 1.5.

NOTE: The sum of all hours should be entered in the space to the right of "Total University Time". All percentages must total 100%.

Re: Verification of Personnel Data

The information contained on the attached forms is from the University's master payroll-personnel file. A continued effort is being made to verify and update the information annually by asking the employees and department heads to review the forms and make any necessary corrections or complete any blanks with appropriate information. The forms furnished represent regular employees on file March 6, 1979. For those personnel who did not receive a form, please notify the Office of Personnel Services at 8391. A checklist of the forms issued is included for your convenience.

The following are provided as guidelines and for informational purposes:

Employee Area

Years of service is an adjusted date of University service and each change must be verified by the appropriate personnel office.

Ethnic origins are designated to comply with the latest EEOC regulations. An individual's ethnic origin must be placed into one of those categories so identified.

We are required to capture information regarding an employee's veteran status. We have listed all employees in a non-veteran status, therefore, this information must be corrected for those employees who are veterans.

Department Area

1. Title Code - if in doubt, contact the appropriate personnel office.
2. Appointment Date - this date is used for the official date for the employment of an individual for the beginning of pay, enrollment of benefits, etc. On this date, an individual becomes an employee of the University.
3. Standard Work Week and Percent of Full-time - this provides information as to whether an employee is full-time or part-time and is assigned on the basis of the percent of full-time employment. A standard work week is not required for academic, non-classified nor gratis appointments; however, a percentage is required on all appointments (including gratis, classified, and unclassified). Example: If a full-time academic workload is 12 semester hours and a special lecturer teaches one 3 semester hour course, his percent of full-time is 24%; a graduate assistant teaching 6 semester hours or working 15 to 20 hours a week would be 50%. Appointments for less than full-time should be expressed as a percentage of the time and/or services required of a full-time (100%) employee in a similar position.

The following statement may serve as an abstract of my proposed talk.

Evidence for a sacred mushroom cult among the Maya

Although a sacred mushroom cult is known among some contemporary Indian societies in Mexico, none has been discovered elsewhere in the Americas. The existence of such a cult in the past, however, has been postulated largely on the basis of evidence from mushroom stones found in Guatemala. This assumption has now been fortified by a study of Maya and Aztec codices which provide graphic evidence that mushrooms were used ceremonially by those civilizations in pre-Columbian times. A new interpretation of part of a previously undescribed Guatemalan codex suggests the ritual use of mushrooms identified as Amanita muscaria.

Since no date was mentioned by either of us, may I suggest the following alternatives: April 18(W) or 19(th) or 20(F). I would like to plan my arrival at least 2 hours in advance of the presentation. If you have a Kodak Carousel projector I would prefer to use it for the approximately 30 slides I plan to show. I will need a blackboard but have my own supply of chalk.

For any biographical data you care to use, I refer you to p. 143 of the monograph on Tremellales in "Flora Neotropica" vol.6, 1971.

If a flexible definition of "practical" is allowed, the following may be cited.

During the summers of 1970 and 1971, ethnomycological investigations were made in Guatemala and El Salvador. The work involved, in part, the study of Mayan artifacts known as mushroom stones. The National Museum of Anthropology in Guatemala City invited me to study their unclassified stone sculptures which resulted in my finding about 18 objects, some of them fragments, but sufficiently characteristic to allow me to identify and classify them. These pieces have consequently been removed from the depository where they had been kept for many years and combined with other artifacts of this type in the general collections, some of which form part of a permanent exhibit in the main salon. The museum has the largest collection ~~extant~~ of mushroom stones extant in any public institution.

Re: Report on Research and Practical Applications

A memorandum from the Chancellor requests that we compile an account of particular examples of practical applications resulting from research findings. The purpose is to publicize LSU's accomplishments and to call attention to the unique role of LSU in the state. I regard this as being highly important for the University.

Most of our research in the College has eventual practical applications although the practical connection may be as remote as electric motors and Faraday's comment about magnetism. But in many cases there are discernable applications. In the current tidelands oil revenue-sharing dispute with the federal government, for example, LSU experts were able to make significant contributions to bolster the case for Louisiana. Dr. John Loos was able to trace the historical background of certain early regional relationships concerning the claims under dispute in the coastal areas. Similarly, Dr. George Lowery's specialized knowledge was used in testimony he gave concerning the Tern Island bird sanctuary and with respect to the tidelands claims. More directly related, of course, was Dr. James Morgan's deposition in the same case with regard to coastal geology and geography.

There are many other research activities which have eventual or immediate practical applications. Our demographic studies relate to the state budget and to the economic development of Louisiana. We have other studies on learning, nutrition, genetics, physiology, etc. which have practical applications and which can be publicized.

Therefore, please compile a list of research activities in your department which have practical applications and send this compilation to me by September 29, 1972 or earlier. What is needed is a brief statement of the research finding and its practical application. Please identify the researcher and your department in the compilation. If you have nothing to report, please write "none" along with your name at the bottom of this letter.

A New Genus of the Tremellales and Its  
Phylogenetic Significance

B. Lowy, *Louisiana State University*

Among the Heterobasidiomycetidae, the Tremellales constitute a group of fungi characterized by great variation in basidial morphology while the Homobasidiomycetidae include fungi with aseptate basidia having a relatively stable morphology. The evolutionary line leading from the Tremellaceae to the Ceratobasidiaceae has been elucidated by Linder and others but the phylogenetic position of the Tulasnellaceae has remained somewhat enigmatic. The new genus, *Pseudotulasnella*, found by the author in Guatemala, because of its *partially septate basidia*, is considered to be clearly intermediate between the Tremellaceae and the Tulasnellaceae and provides additional evidence that evolution in this group has taken place in the direction of the loss of basidial septation. The only other genus of Tremellales known to have partially septate basidia is *Metabourdotia*, described from Tahiti. This genus is reinterpreted as belonging to the Tremellaceae and when so considered, provides a significant link between the sebacinoïd basidium and the tulasnelloid, through *Pseudotulasnella*.

Number of hours should be expressed in decimal fractions only if necessary. Limit fractions to one position.

If additional space is needed to answer any of the questions on this report enter the number and letter of the question(s) and the description in the "Remarks" section or on a separate sheet of paper and attach it to the report. Be sure to include the average number of hours per week spent in such activities.

Since the data from the academic personnel reports is keypunched and processed by the computer, it is important that: (1) data inserted on the form be handwritten, (2) any changes made to the pre-printed social security number should be made so the incorrect number is still legible.

The data for 8000 and 9000 level courses reflects the total students for whom you are responsible and the average credit hour for which each has registered. This information was submitted by department heads earlier this session. Check the pre-printed information for accuracy and completeness. Make necessary corrections concerning this information. Delete courses by drawing a line through them. For reporting other time devoted to 8000 and 9000 level courses, see Section II. B, "Supervision of Graduate Students."

Department: Show department abbreviation and code number on each line containing course data.

Course Number: Only one course number can be shown on each line. Please list no more than 10 courses per APR. If more than 10 courses are being taught, attach a second APR showing those courses.

Type Section: Should be either lecture, laboratory, individual, or research.

Credit Hours: If instruction is not shared, the figure representing credit hours should be the total credit hours a student earns for the course. If it is a multiple instructor course or if the instruction is shared, including graduate assistants, then the total credit hours must be allocated among the faculty members reporting the course. The credit hours as shown were supplied by department heads on the "Faculty Assignment Reports" where they indicated the credit hours taught by each faculty member in Multiple Instructor Courses.

Multiple Instructor Courses: If the pre-printed course data does not reflect the shared credit hours correctly or if a multiple instructor course was not printed then the following is an example on how it should be reported.

When two or more instructors (including graduate assistants), share in the instruction of a course, each instructor should share in the student credit hours produced. For example, a 3 hour course comprised of 2 hours of lecture and 2 hours of lab instruction which is taught at different times by 2 different instructors with 10 students enrolled will produce a total of 30 SCH's. However, the instructor teaching the lecture should show on his report 2 credit hours for the lecture part of the course with 10 students enrolled, and the instructor teaching the lab should show 1 credit hour for the lab part of the course with 10 students enrolled. One of the instructors should show his hours of class contact in the "Instructions Not Shared" section, and the other instructor should show his hours of class contact in the "Instruction Shared" section.

If two (2) graduate assistants equally teach the lab portion of the course, they should each show .5 credit hour value for the course with 10 students enrolled, and also hours of class contact in the "Instruction Shared" section. The instructor teaching the lecture should show his hours of class contact in the "Instruction Not Shared" section.

Only one instructor in a multiple instructor course should show hours of class contact in the "Instruction Not Shared" section. All others should show hours of class contact in the "Instruction Shared" section along with the name(s) of the instructor(s) with whom the instruction is being shared.

**Variable Credit Courses:** In the case of variable credit courses, such as 8000 and 9000 level, information obtained from "Faculty Assignment Forms" for these courses was summarized and appears on the APR as such. For example, if a faculty member was shown to be involved with three students enrolled at the 8000 level and was shown getting credits of 3, 6, and 9 hours, his APR would show one 8000 level course with 3 students enrolled for 6 hours credit which is the average of 3, 6, and 9. Thus  $(3 \times 6) 18$  student credit hours would be generated, the same as  $3 + 6 + 9 = 18$ .

See Section II. B, for explanation of other time spent with graduate students.

**Number Enrolled:** The number enrolled is as of the final date for adding courses for credit. In lecture-lab courses, the number enrolled in the lab(s) should equal the number enrolled in the lecture. Do not change the number enrolled as shown unless the section has been split, or for some other similar reason.

**Clock Hours of Instruction:** The figures to be entered under "Instruction Not Shared" and "Instruction Shared" should represent the actual number of clock hours you face the class per week in each course. No preparation time should be reported here. The "Total Hours Per Week" column should include the number of hours you face the class, preparation time, grading papers, etc. Please limit decimal to one position.

**Supervisory Responsibility of Courses:** Also in Section II. A, include courses for which you have supervisory responsibility. For example, this could include supervision of freshmen English, supervision of laboratory instruction in Biology, etc. Show department and course number in these courses where possible, and total hours per week spent in such courses. Number of students and credit hour should be left blank.

**Extension and Correspondence Courses:** Extension and Correspondence courses are to be reported in the appropriate spaces. Be sure to report courses which meet only part of the session.

## III. RESEARCH

Include time spent under each category. Items A-C represent time spent on contract research from federal, state, and private sources. # Faculty personnel input is sought

The Faculty Senate passed a resolution Monday calling for high tenure and promotion standards and for "formal faculty input" before the Board of Supervisors acts on matters pertaining to "academic policy."

The resolution, which was adopted by a vote of 34-11, was prompted by the board's recent action in reinstating and granting tenure to Paul Grosser, assistant professor of political science. Grosser's teaching contract had not been renewed by the administration of the Baton Rouge campus. The reason given was that he failed to produce sufficient scholarly research.

Since he was conceded to be an effective teacher, Grosser became a symbol of the debate over whether research is as important as effective teaching - known as the "publish or perish" controversy.

The resolution adopted by the Faculty Senate does not specifically condemn the board action in reinstating Grosser, but rather accuses the board of exhibiting "a disregard for faculty opinion by allowing no faculty input immediately before final action was taken on a matter of serious academic consequences."

The board acted twice on the Grosser case. The first time, his supporters were unable to obtain the necessary nine votes to reinstate him. The second time, Sept. 30, there were sufficient votes. The board limited debate at that session, refusing to

hear from several faculty members who appeared at that meeting.

The Faculty Senate, in the resolution, "affirms the status of the Baton Rouge campus as the 'comprehensive university' of the state."

"To achieve the standards required by that status 'the current tenure and promotion policies, which recognize both teaching and scholarly activity, must continue to be raised,'" the resolution says.

Before voting on the resolution, the Senate defeated an amendment offered by Bernard Lowy, professor of botany.

Lowy had pushed to include in the resolution a statement that "all matters pertaining to academic policy are both the right and the duty of the faculty."

Lowy also wanted to strengthen the document to resolve that "consultation with the duly appointed faculty representatives be mandatory before final action by the board on all matters pertaining to academic policy be promulgated."

His proposed amendment was defeated by a vote of 18 for and 26 against.

During debate on the amendment Daniel W. Yannitall, associate professor of engineering science and secretary of the senate, said he was not certain of the correctness of the proposed statement pertaining to the rights of the faculty in academic policy.

"There's nothing in the by-laws of the

board or the state constitution that gives the faculty any such rights," Yannitall said.

Noting that some observers have interpreted the board's action to mean that the board doesn't believe in the stated policies of tenure and promotion, he said "one thing we've got to do is reaffirm those policies."

Joe Parker, associate professor of education, moved to table the resolution.

"I wonder if the board had not overridden (the administration in the Grosser case) if the faculty would have wanted input," Parker said.

Parker said the senate did not have all the factual information needed to act.

"I submit we are acting hastily and that our actions will be misinterpreted," Parker said.

The move to table the resolution failed by a 20 for and 24 against vote.

Howard L'Enfant of the Law School warned the senate to be very clear about whom they mean by the term "faculty" when they talk about the board listening to the faculty.

L'Enfant pointed out that in the Grosser case, the board did listen to the "faculty" in the sense that the board went along with the recommendation of the tenured faculty members of the political science department who had recommended tenure for Grosser.

W.J. Peevy, professor of agronomy, said mistakes were made in the Grosser case by both the administration of the Baton Rouge campus and by the Board of Supervisors.

He said the case was "snafued" by the administration and that the board made a mistake in rehiring and giving tenure to a faculty member.

He said the matter "should be put behind us."

Peevy said he wishes Grosser "would be big enough" to resign.

At the start of yesterday's proceedings, the senate heard from Dr. James G. Traynham, vice chancellor for advance studies and research, dean of the Graduate School and professor of chemistry.

Traynham served on the committee of administrators that makes recommendations on promotions and tenure.

He said that universities have a responsibility for generating new knowledge and that meritorious teaching alone is not sufficient.

Plugging for a commitment to research as well as to effective classroom teaching, Traynham borrowed a line from cartoonist Charles Schultz--"It's hard to win at chess with a checkers mentality."

Following Traynham's presentation, members of the senate unanimously expressed approval of his remarks.
