*About the Institute*

The Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation, a research division of Carnegie Mellon University, specializes in the history of botany and all aspects of plant science and serves the international scientific community through research and documentation. To this end, the Institute acquires and maintains authoritative collections of books, plant images, manuscripts, portraits and data files, and provides publications and other modes of information service. The Institute meets the reference needs of botanists, biologists, historians, conservationists, librarians, bibliographers and the public at large, especially those concerned with any aspect of the North American flora.

Hunt Institute was dedicated in 1961 as the Rachel McMasters Miller Hunt Botanical Library, an international center for bibliographical research and service in the interests of botany and horticulture, as well as a center for the study of all aspects of the history of the plant sciences. By 1971 the Library's activities had so diversified that the name was changed to Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation. Growth in collections and research projects led to the establishment of four programmatic departments: Archives, Art, Bibliography and the Library.

43 autograph letters to  
Mademoiselle Joséphine Redouté,  
daughter of P.J. Redouté  
and a botanical artist in her own right.

Janin was a close and valued friend  
of the family and acted as one of the  
four pallbearers at the funeral of  
Redouté, 1840.

A few of these short letters antedate  
the death of Redouté, but the great  
majority were written between 1840 and 1848  
it would seem.

One letter is followed by a page of  
transcription signed Anatole, probably  
Prince Anatole Demidoff, a good friend  
of Jules Janin

Added one letter addressed to "Chère soeur"  
but not otherwise identified.

The whole group comes from the estate  
of Joséphine Redouté and her heirs.
