To this end, the Institute acquires and maintains authoritative collections of books, plant images, manuscripts, portraits and data files, and provides publications and other modes of information service. The Institute meets the reference needs of botanists, biologists, historians, conservationists, librarians, bibliographers and the public at large, especially those concerned with any aspect of the North American flora.

Hunt Institute was dedicated in 1961 as the Rachel McMasters Miller Hunt Botanical Library, an international center for bibliographical research and service in the interests of botany and horticulture, as well as a center for the study of all aspects of the history of the plant sciences. By 1971 the Library's activities had so diversified that the name was changed to Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation. Growth in collections and research projects led to the establishment of four programmatic departments: Archives, Art, Bibliography and the Library.

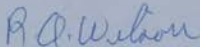

BOTANY SEMINAR

Dean Hall, Room 8, 11:00 A. M., Friday, March 23, 1962.

The first speaker from outside the University on this semester's Botany Department seminar program is one of two brothers who have induced a lot of thought and discussion among ecologists. Their work has been largely in the new field of productivity where they have pioneered a lot of the thinking in reference to terrestrial communities. However, as collaborators, these men, Dr. Eugene P. and Dr. Howard T. Odum, produced a classic in atoll ecology working at the Eniwetok Marine Laboratory (Ecological Monographs 25: 291-320, 1955) which received a sizeable award and notice as the best ecological paper of its time.

This week Dr. Eugene P. Odum will speak to the seminar group under the title:

"THE ENERGY FLOW APPROACH TO THE STUDY OF POPULATIONS"

It is expected that Dr. Odum will be on the campus presenting other formal and informal topics and will be available for discussion of ecological and especially the more essentially productivity topics.

MID-CONGRESS FIELD TRIP NO. 5

Missisquoi Bay Area

Leader: Bernard Boivin

After leaving Montreal, the group travels through the flood-plain, a rich flat farming area, the only prominent features being the Monteregian Hills, a group of eight small mountains of volcanic origin. The bridge over the St. Lawrence River provides a good view of the recently opened "Seaway."

The road from Laprairie to Saint-Jean is one of the oldest in Canada. For centuries, it has been a portage used by Indians gathering at what is now Montreal, and was the shortest way between New York and Montreal: Hudson River -- Lake Champlain -- Richelieu River. Kalm (1749) and Michaux (1792) both travelled along that road and their respective diaries, especially Kalm's, devote many pages to the region, which is also the "locus typicus" of several species described by Linnaeus and Michaux.

Crossing the Richelieu River at Saint-Jean, a small city with a rich historical past, we turn to the right towards Clarenceville. First stop is between Clarenceville and Venise, on route 52, where we find a large marsh with the tall grass Zizania aquatica and hummocks of Decodon verticillatus (Lythraceae).

Trees and shrubs are mostly Acer rubrum, Alnus rugosa var. americana, Cornus stolonifera, C. obliqua.

Other species to look for include Equisetum palustre, Glyceria canadensis, G. grandis, Carex lacustris, C. scoparia, C. tribuloides, C. lupulina, C. lurida, C. retrorsa, Scirpus atrovirens, S. rubrotinctus, S. pedicellatus, Asclepias incarnata, Verbena hastata, Lobelia cardinalis, Scutellaria lateriflora, etc. A recent invader: Epilobium hirsutum.

About 1000 feet further east, another stop to look (but just look!) at Rhus Vernix, Aronia melanocarpa, A. prunifolia (of Coastal Plain affinity) and Woodwardia virginica.

At Venise, a summer resort, are low woods with Osmunda spp., Onoclea and various sedges. Please be cautious about poison-ivy (Rhus radicans) and its bushy phase: var. Rydbergii. Contact with it produces a painful dermatitis. This is true also of R. Vernix.

On the sandy beach: Cyperus spp., Gerardia tenuifolia, Aster spp., Bidens spp., Xanthium spp., Polanisia graveolens, etc.

After lunch, we head towards Philipsburg, and Saint-Armand, in a quite different floristic subprovince, the westernmost extension of the Appalachian

chain and the only locality in Quebec of several southern species. The bedrock is dolomite, warming up quite rapidly and south-facing: the spring-flowering plants are in bloom there earlier than in Montreal. They belong mostly to the following genera: Allium, Desmodium, Sanicula, Phryma, Aralia, Asarum, Uvularia, Erythronium, Carex, Polygonatum, Trillium, Panax, Actaea, Galium, etc.

Ferns of interest: Woodsia obtusa, Adiantum pedatum, our prettiest species, depicted by Cornut in 1635; Camptosorus rhizophyllus, the "walking-fern," Dryopteris simulata, D. Goldiana, D. marginalis; Asplenium platyneuron, A. trichomanes, etc.

By August a lot of species have entirely disappeared, but unusual plants like Phytolacca americana, various Aster and Solidago can still be seen. Other aspects of the countryside are quite unique with us. The Lake Estate where we are, for instance, has been in the hands of the same family for nearly two centuries.

Along the abandoned railway are found other arenicolous species of southern affinity like Polygonella articulata, Bulbostylis capillaris, Cyperus filiculmis, etc. (Text written by Marcel Raymond.)

Time: August 7 - 13

Departure of Trip: The train leaves Winnipeg from the Canadian National Railways (C.N.R.) Station on Main Street (at the foot of Broadway Ave.), at 1:30 p.m. (13.30 hours) central standard time, on Friday, August 7,

Registration: A Congress desk, located in the station, will be open on Wednesday and Thursday (August 5 and 6) from 10.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m., and on Friday (August 7) until time of departure. Report at this Congress desk and pay the balance of the cost of the trip, receive your tickets, badges and other materials necessary for the Trip.

The trip to Churchill and return is entirely by train. If you drive your own car to Winnipeg, you should arrange to leave it in one of the garages or parking lots nearby for the 7-day period. Weekly terms are usually available for car storage. Lockers for storage of hand baggage are available at the Station.

Advance Arrival: Persons arriving in Winnipeg before the day of departure of the trip will make their own arrangements for hotel accommodation. The following are large hotels conveniently located to the railway station: Fort Garry (C.N.R.) Hotel and Royal Alexandria (C.P.R.) Hotel.

Weather and Clothing: Field apparel will be in fashion from the time of departure. The season at Churchill is normally warm to somewhat cool, although some uncomfortably cool and windy days are experienced. A windbreaker and extra sweater are recommended. Knee boots are not required, but waterproof foot wear is desirable, especially in the event of rainy weather.

Night accommodation and meals will be aboard the train. At Churchill box lunches will be taken into the field as required. Tipping of dining car waiters and sleeping-car porters will be attended to by the trip organizer

and is included in the cost of the trip. The train will include a baggage car, so a reasonable amount of baggage (clothing, collecting equipment, etc.) may be brought. There will be no laundry service, except by private arrangement at Churchill.

Collecting of Specimens: There are no restrictions on botanical collecting at Churchill and those who wish to take specimens should bring their own equipment.

Communications: Mail and telegrams should be addressed "Care of: International Botanical Congress Field Trip, Churchill, Manitoba".

First aid equipment only will be available on train but medical facilities are available at Churchill where arrangements can be made to take out emergency cases by air.

Botanical Information: A brochure will be supplied which will include a botanical account of the Churchill area, notes on the climate and physical features, a checklist of the native vascular plants, lists of the flora of various habitats, and a bibliography.

Return Arrival: The train is scheduled to arrive back at Winnipeg at 9.30 a.m. on Thursday, August 13.

Participants intending to join Field Trip 5 should proceed directly to the University of Manitoba for registration and assignment of accommodation in connection with that Trip. Since the University is several miles distance from the railway station, arrangements for meeting and transporting you there will be made by the Trip 5 organizer.
