Scope and Contents

This collection includes correspondence, accounts and related miscellany. The persons involved include Col. Humphrey Waldo Sibthorp; Richard Waldo Sibthorp; Henry Sibthorp; Henry's uncle, M. E. Sewell; Henry's unnamed brother; Gervaise Tottenham Waldo Sibthorp; Charles Waldo Sibthorp; and Mrs. Juliet Hawkins, addressed as "sister" by Richard Waldo Sibthorp. Also found here are documents, including Humphrey Sibthorp's commission (1794) as colonel in the army, signed by King George III of England, and Gervaise Tottenham Waldo Sibthorp's commission as captain in the Royal North Lincoln Militia (1847). These items are nonbotanical, and there is nothing of famous botanists Humphrey or John Sibthorp.

Biographical / Historical

[Information from Ancestry.com records: Ward Family Tree] Richard Waldo Sibthorp's eldest brother, Coningsby Waldo Sibthorp, died on 9 March 1822, after being gravely injured in a coach accident thought to have been caused when the linchpin was removed from his coach by political opponents. Their mother, Susanna Sibthorp (née Ellison) (1777–1826), was still alive at this time.

Scope and Contents

Includes three items:

One autograph letter from Cuvier to Deleuse, asking to borrow [drawings] from Deleuse and also returning some of Deleuse's [darwings, specimens?].

A statement (written in French: [translation: "From March 9, 1830, Memoire of M Milne Edwards {Henri Milne-Edwards (1800–1885)} followed particular arrangement of the gill apparatus with some crustaceans. Certified compliant, G Cuvier"]) signed by Cuvier, 1830.

A slip of paper, dated "Leipzig, Sommer 1891", with signatures including C. H. (Carl Hermann) Credner (1841–1913), geologist and paleontologist. and (Karl Georg Friedrich Rudolf) Leuckart (1822–1898), zoologist.
